

# Oldtimers edge out M and M in quarter finals

The first games of the Georgetown Men's Flag Football League playoffs were played at Georgetown District High School Sunday.

All of the eight teams in the league participated in the quarter finals that morning. The Dawgs, who were first-place during the regular season, were matched against the last-place Mold Masters in an 8:45 a.m. game.

The result was not exactly a scenario where David killed Goliath, since the Dawgs triumphed over the young team 30-8, advancing to the semi-finals.

In the first half, Linas Stasiulis scored a touchdown for the Dawgs. Other touchdowns were added by fellow players Alain Pelland and Dennis Hanley. Two

pass converts were played by Wayne Stasiulis. This part of the game was, in short, reserved entirely for the "Dawg" pound.

Mold Masters finally got into the game towards the end of the second half, with West Samis scoring a touchdown. Even with two points added on by Ian Paul, their team was unable to avoid elimination.

The next game was scheduled for 10:00 a.m., with the Longhorns playing Plus Welding.

One may remember Longhorns' win over the Dawgs in last week's final game of the regular season, except that the team continued its fine playing form early in the playoffs.

What the Longhorns and the Dawgs had in common was first-half domination. Two touchdowns by Bob Davey were aided by Paul Allison. Dave Paterson scored a

convert.

Plus Welding came into the scoring picture in the second half, with Marcus Noel scoring his team's sole touchdown. But the Longhorns came back with a vengeance, with another touchdown by Davey (thus making him the team's "player of the game"). Three convert passes by Paterson, plus touchdowns by Bruce Mitchell and Mark Hamilton, equalling a 41-6 win over Plus Welding.

These teams made way for a showdown between Meznic Electric and The Glen.

Stu Lunn opened the first half with a touchdown for Meznic. Ken Lockwood and his brother, Jeff, had respective interceptions and converts. Jeff came back with a one-point kick as Steve Crossman booted a touchdown. At half-time, it was Meznic Elec-

tric 14, Glen 0.

After Jeff Lockwood scored a field goal in the second half, the Glen's Mike Henderson played with a touchdown. That was the only scoring his team got in the game, even after Jeff's convert and Randy Lunn's touchdown.

Meznic Electric won the game over the Glen 32-6 and will appear in next week's semi-finals.

Perhaps the closest match in the quarter finals belonged to the Oldtimers and M and M Pro Sports. During the regular season, they were in the middle of the league's standings.

When the game started at 12:30 p.m., M and M's Shawn Taras had a touchdown. However, Oldtimers got into the game early, with Doug Stamp tying the game at six. A one-point convert pass by Doug Pembleton was topped by opponent Bill Fournier's field goal.

Taras' sequel touchdown and

Fournier's convert helped their team lead the Oldtimers 16-7 midway in the game.

Oldtimers figured predominantly in the second half, with John Viera scoring a touchdown. Pembleton's one-pointer further narrowed M and M's lead, soon eclipsing it with Bill Davis' interception, a touchdown by Stamp and a convert pass by Brian Beaumont. Pembleton also gave a point to his team in a kickoff.

M and M made a comeback, with a touchdown by Mark McKeon and Fournier's convert. That concluded regulation time with a 23-23 tie, leading the two teams into overtime play.

The Oldtimers pulled ahead by six points, with a touchdown by Beaumont. Pembleton assured his team's 30-23 victory and berth in the semi-finals with a one-point convert - without M and M's interception by Gord McNeily.
