

Winners named by Arts Alive

Arts Alive and The Halton Hills Herald are pleased to announce the winners of the first Arts Achievement Awards. The Herald approached Arts Alive with the award concept to help celebrate its 125th Anniversary. Arts Alive agreed that recognition for the arts was both needed and desired. Nominations were solicited in the following areas: The Ralph Ursel Award - for volunteerism in the arts community, The Kenneth R. Harrison Award for working with youth in the arts and Arts Alive Awards for visual arts and performing arts.

A committee formed of Arts Alive members and representatives in the community chosen

by the Herald, met last Tuesday to discuss the nominations. The winners are: Ralph Ursel Award - John Sommer, Kenneth R. Harrison Award - Paul Brisley, Arts Alive Award for Performing Arts - Ron Hunt, Arts Alive Award for Visual Arts - Frank and Fran Anthony.

The Arts Achievement Awards will be given to worthy recipients every five years. The 1991 awards will be presented Oct. 18 at a reception hosted by the Herald.

Each winner will be given a take home award signifying their achievement. A plaque will be placed in the Cultural Centre foyer on permanent display to honor the winners for their contribution to the community.

Cultural Centre 10 years young

This exhibition will have its opening on October 2 from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and will continue to December 1, 1991.

The exhibition is to honor some of the visual artists that have made the Gallery of the Cultural Centre such an interesting and challenging place to come to since the first exhibition that took place there (Marjorie Nazar) in October 1981.

Fire calls

Busy weekend

Halton Hills firefighters responded to six calls this past weekend starting with a motor vehicle accident on King St. in Georgetown Friday afternoon.

Firefighters were called to wash down a gasoline leak at the accident scene.

An hour later, at 5:50 p.m., firefighters responded to an alarm activation at the Durham St. seniors home in Georgetown. When they arrived, they discovered the alarm had been set off by burnt toast.

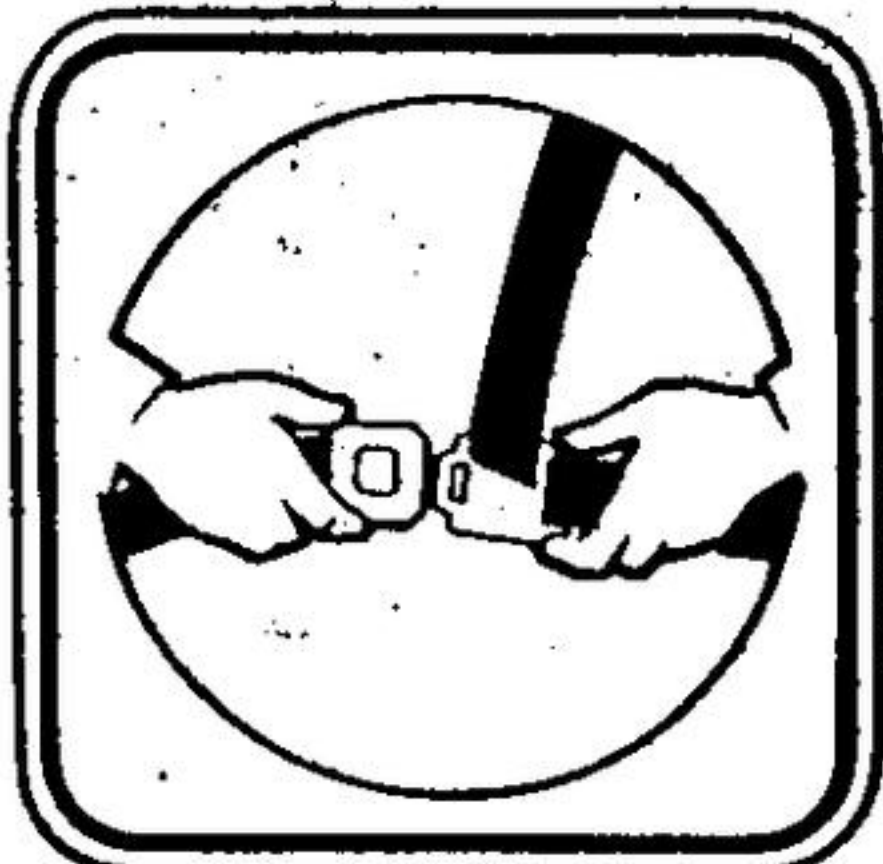
At 9:50 the same night, firefighters were called to the scene of a motor vehicle accident on Conc. 9 in Halton Hills but when they arrived, the victims had already escaped the vehicles and firefighters assistance was not required.

On Saturday, firefighters began the day responding to an alarm activation at the Hyde Park seniors residence where the alarm had been set off by burnt eggs.

That evening, at 10:48, firefighters kept people a safe distance from fallen hydro lines until Halton Hills Hydro arrived to fix the lines. The lines had fallen after

the hydro post was struck by a motor vehicle.

Their last call came on Sunday at 3:30 p.m. to a grass fire on Lot 1, Conc. 8 in Halton Hills. Firefighters say a landowner had been burning rubbish and the fire spread to the grass and a small pile of wood. There was no damage.

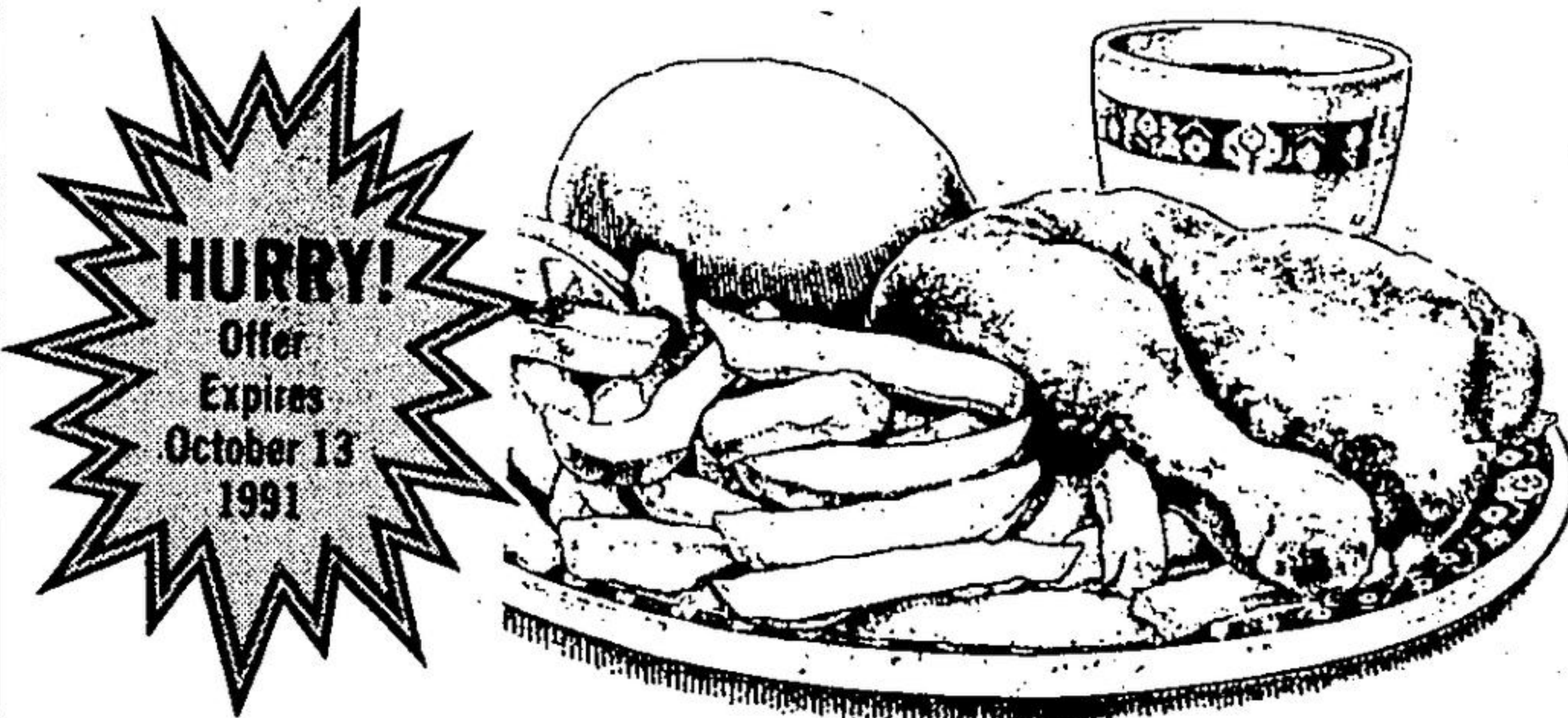
