

# Nassagaweya Art Show and Sale must viewing

The opportunity to discover high quality original art draws people to the Annual Nassagaweya Art Show and Sale, Friday and Saturday, October 4 and 5. Now in its third year, this year's Show and Sale will feature the works of 23 artists from the surrounding area presenting their works in the Nassagaweya Community Centre, Guelph Line, 6 km north of Hwy. 401 in the hamlet of Brookville.

"We are again pleased at the quality of the artists represented," stated Betty Bassett, Chairman of the show. "Their talents are represented in a wide variety of mediums and a good selection of price ranges. Each year our committee works to maintain the high standards the show has come to represent, and introduce new ideas to make it even more exciting." This year's show will also

feature an exhibition of the best of Student Art, as submitted by Halton area high schools. The creativity of the participating artists will again be recognized with awards of "Best in Show," "Best Booth," "Awards of Merit," and "People's Choice," awards by dignitaries and celebrities attending the show.

The Art Show and Sale traditionally also introduces the Annual Ebenezer United Church Women Fund Raising Draw. This year's prizes are truly exceptional. Robert Bateman has donated the first prize, an artist proof of his print, "Above the River - Trumpeter Swans." Wyget Woods of Nassagaweya has donated the framing. Thomas Thekan, furniture maker, Campbellville, has given the second prize, a hand-crafted mahogany Windsor arm chair, and Jack Tanner's Table at the Old Hide House in Acton is giving Dinner for Two. Loom-Woods Ltd. of Nassagaweya will award a pine mirror to the person selling the first prize ticket.

"We are delighted that an artist of Mr. Bateman's calibre has chosen to support our project in such a generous manner," states Ms. Bassett. "It is significant that such a well-known and respected artist with roots in our area would support this show which showcases local talent."

Artists selected to exhibit include Irene McIlleen and Linda Terras of Acton, Anne Nayler of Caledon East, Linda Shantz, Eugene Cody, Barbara Ayres and Ruth Mudge of Campbellville, Dick Marvin of Moffat, Vivian De Winter of Cambridge, Linda Kemp of Fenwick, Norman MacDonald of Erin, Linda Donais and Laura Kingsberry of Georgetown, John McCreery and John Mattar of Guelph, Vicki Ferras of Milton, Alistar Morrison, Doris Law and Andrew Samuel of Oakville, Johanna VanKempen of Richmond Hill, Ron Kindt and Donna Diamond of Rockwood, and Terry McDonald of Streetsville.

About half of the artists have exhibited at the show in previous years, while the balance will debut this year. They were selected from the many entries received this year. The medias represented will include watercolours, pastels, oils, photography, sculpture and porcelain painting.

Tickets on the Bateman print will be offered for sale at the show and continue to be available until the draw at the Annual Ebenezer Beef Dinner on

November 1st.

Nassagaweya, which includes the hamlets of Campbellville, Moffat, Brookville, Haltonville and Eden Mills is noted for its many art-related businesses. Many of these local artisans are supporting the art show by offering their unique crafts as door prizes. The art show catalogue will detail these locations and visitors may wish to allow time to visit these shops.

The ribbon cutting Opening Ceremony will take place at 4:30

p.m. on Friday, featuring Federal, Provincial and Municipal dignitaries. Admission is \$2 for adults, \$1 for seniors and students with children free.

The show is sponsored by the Ebenezer United Church Women. The Church, located on the Guelph Line north of Brookville, has a tradition of varied community events, and is currently building an addition to the Church which will serve the community with activities for all age groups.

**THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS**

**MAYOR** - to be elected at large and serve as a member on both the Regional Municipality of Halton and Town of Halton Hills Councils.

**4 COUNCILLORS** - To serve on both the Regional Municipality of Halton and Town of Halton Hills Councils - One such Councillor to be elected from each of the four Wards.
