

## Hurricanes Hockey McNally Minor Novices split two game road trip

The McNally Construction Georgetown Minor Novice AA hockey team played two out-of-town games this past week.

On October 1, at Thompson Arena, Georgetown shut out the hometown Milton squad 2-0 in a very exciting game.

The first period, though extremely fast-paced, ended in a scoreless tie. The second period was Georgetown's strongest of the game, partly due to very aggressive defense by Kyle Hotham.

Despite the intensity of the play, it was not until the halfway mark that Bradley Snow scored the first goal on what was Georgetown's first shot on net. Exactly two minutes later, Graham McCulloch scored on a breakaway shot from Brad Snow.

The final period, though scoreless, was highlighted by exciting breakaway shots from defensemen Tim Mansfield and Alex Durham and also right winger Mark Fantegrossi.

The match ended with a well-deserved shut out for goaltender Ryan LaRose, who was greatly assisted throughout the game by three strong defensive lines.

Last Saturday Georgetown faced the Oakville Rangers at Maplegrove Arena in Oakville. Our boys played another great game, which could very well have gone either way, however

they dropped it to the Rangers 2-1.

There was no score in the first period with both teams failing to capitalize on powerplay opportunities. During the second period, Martin Lefevre made a great defensive play and prevented a possible Oakville goal with his chase and poke check stopping a Ranger breakaway directly in front of the net.

With only 40 seconds left in the period, goalie Ryan LaRose made a good save but had no chance against the rebound shot that gave Oakville their first goal.

Early in the third, Bradley Snow scored for Georgetown after a scuffle in front of the net. It looked as though it might end in a tie, when late in the game Oakville got their second goal. Georgetown head coach Paul LaRose pulled the goalie at the last minutes of play.

The strategy proved to be a good one as the six attackers kept the pressure on, never allowing the puck to leave the Oakville end and getting several shots on net. The strong Oakville defense, however, held them off not allowing Georgetown to get the tying goal.

This Saturday Georgetown hosts Chinguacousy at Memorial Arena at 4 p.m. On Sunday they travel to Streetsville to play at Vic Johnson Arena at 4:30 p.m.
