Paul was a co-founder of the Centennial Alumni Choir along with Lois Barrager. The choir, for graduates of the school, was set up so students could carry on with their love of singing and performing.

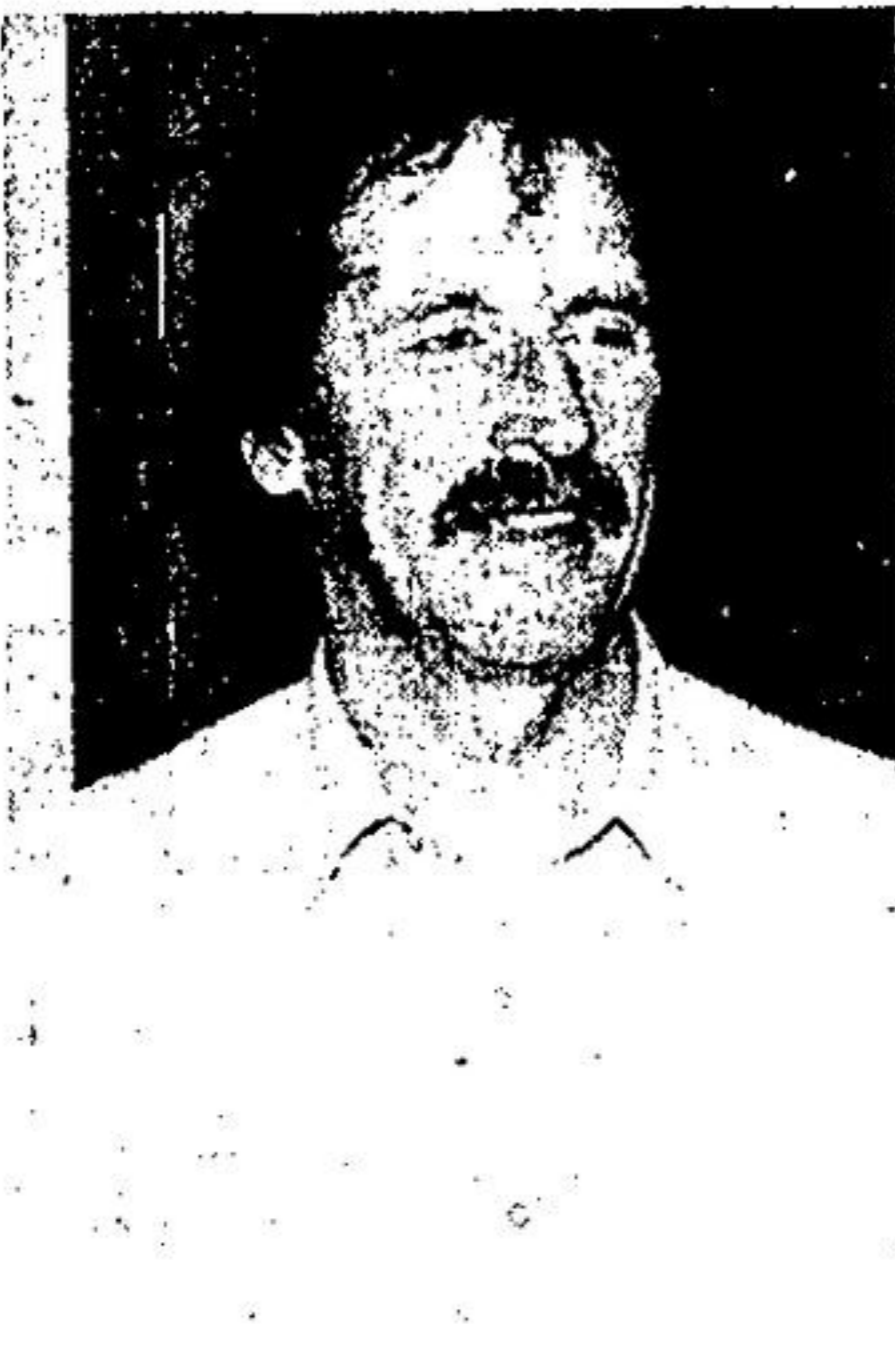

Paul has taken time to add to the Arts community working with Globe Productions. He was Old Man Carnes in "Oklahoma" and the ragtime piano player in "New Girl in Town." He also was music director for "Mame" and "Hello Dolly."

Paul's first love, as he will readily tell you, is working with young people and advancing their love and knowledge for music and entertaining.

Another part of his commitment to the community has been his role in Arts Alive, organizing Area North School concerts and bandsharing as well as his wide spectrum of extra curricular activities with the students from teaching guitar, ukulele, theatre arts to field trips to the theatre.

He also regularly organizes school stage productions and talent shows.

Last year, the Centennial School band participated in Halton Music Showcase in Hamilton Place and the Centennial band performed at Burlington's Sound of Music Festival and Canada's Wonderland.

Georgetown's Ron Hunt, a comic actor known for his repertoire of funny faces, is the recipient of the jointly sponsored Halton Hills Herald-Arts Alive Award for performing arts.

Lois Fraser of Limehouse nominated Mr. Hunt describing him as "outstanding."

In her nomination letter to the Arts Alive awards committee, Ms. Fraser stated Mr. Hunt has been entertaining Georgetown audiences for 25 years. "Theatre audiences think to themselves 'oh great' when they see his name on the program. They know they are in for a treat."

Aside from being strong performer, Ms. Fraser said Mr. Hunt is also a tireless worker behind the scenes.

"His talents as director, stage manager, set designer and carpenter make him an ideal member

in amateur theatre circles," she stated.

Mr. Hunt joined Georgetown Little Theatre productions in 1963 and has been a member ever since, save for two years when he performed with the Amerikahaus in Vienna, Austria.

He has been involved in 77 productions with GLT including 42 as an actor, 17 as director, 21 as a set designer and approximately 50 as an assistant set constructor.

Over the years, he has also done lighting design and control and acted as stage manager.

Mr. Hunt stated in a letter his best personal success was when he directed the production 'Mousetrap' in Oct. 1970.

Besides the GLT, Mr. Hunt has also been involved with Globe Productions, Brampton Musical Society and the Peel Pantomime Players.

Award winners will receive their awards on stage at the special John Arpin Concert scheduled for 8 p.m., Oct. 19 at the John Elliott Theatre located in the Halton Hills Cultural Centre on Church St. in Georgetown.
