On Sunday evening, Sept. 29, Norval United Church was full to enjoy an evening of melodious organ music with organist Stanley King of Toronto demonstrating the new Allen Digital organ recently installed in the church.

Mr. King is the organist in two churches in Toronto.

His varied entertaining program demonstrated to the fullest the rich tones to the rousing tune of the closing hymn "Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory."

Mrs. Elaine Crawford, chairman of the Choir Committee, in charge of selecting a new organ, introduced Mr. King who opened the enjoyable program with Psalm 98 - "The Heavens Declare the Glory of God."

This was followed by two Old English selections by S. Wesley to demonstrate the different types of music.

Much pleasure was derived from three lovely gospel-style inspirational hymns, "Great is Thy Faithfulness," "What a Friend

We Have in Jesus," and "This Is My Father's World," after which Mr. King demonstrated how the organ can be played by hands alone and then by feet alone in parts of fugue in G.

For a change of pace, Miss Lorraine Lawrence, a member of the choir, sang a solo, "Under His Wings," accompanied on the piano by church organist Mr. Allen Forde.

Mr. King continued his pleasurable program with the beautiful old song, "The Bells of St. Mary's" with the joyful sound of the bells ringing in our ears. In response to a request, the much-loved old time favorite "Danny Boy" was delightful.

Members of the elders took up the collection for donations towards the purchase of the organ and Rev. Ann Ross Rowsell gave the dedication prayer.

The church "In Memoriam Fund" has covered over half of the organ expense.

The congregation stood to join in singing the closing rousing hymn that was a fitting end to an excellent organ program played by an accomplished organist.

All in all, the people were delighted with the polished performance which demonstrated the capabilities of the new digital organ.

Many people from the surrounding area joined with the United Church members to enjoy the musical evening followed by a social hour.
