Georgetown activist attends congress

A Georgetown woman will join more than 1,000 women activists from around the world at a global Congress this coming week to campaign for an equal say in restoring the planet's health.

The Congress, to be held in Miami, Florida, U.S.A., 8-12 November, 1991, will develop a Women's Action Agenda to take to the 1-12 June 1992 United Nations Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED). UNCED is expected to draw heads of state from as many as 159 nations, making it the largest summit meeting ever held. In addition, thousands of citizen activists are expected in Brazil for a parallel People's Congress. Together, they will comprise the

largest forum ever held for international decision-making on such issues as climate change, species preservation, Earth ethics and sustainable development. Women representing the greater Toronto area include: Dr. Rosalie Bertell, international expert on low level radiation and its long term effects on human populations, Dr. Margrit Eichler, a sociologist who is an expert on the family and the new reproductive technologies, and Joan Davison of Halton Hills, a student at O.I.S.E., whose area is ecofeminism and who is representing P.O.W.E.R.

Michele Landsberg will be the official reporter on the conference.

"Women deserve an equal say in making decisions and development policies that affect the fate of the Earth," noted Joan Davison, "The Action Agenda we create in Miami will ensure that women's voices and concerns are heard at the Earth Summit and all over the world."

The five-day Women's Congress will be conducted as a tribunal with a panel of distinguished women jurists from Guyana, Kenya, Australia, Sweden and India. Margarita Arais, former first lady of Costa Rica and President of the Arias Foundation for Peace and Human Progress, will give the keynote speech.


