## Shattered exposes our vulnerabilities

Shattered is a sit-on-the-edgeof-your-seat suspense film by director Wolfgang Petersen that exposes our own sense of vulnerability.

The movie stars Tom Berenger as Dan Merrick, a survivor of a near fatal car crash. He suffers amnesia and tries to rediscover his former life despite the web of doubts and unanswerable questions before him. Other key figures include Greta Scacchi as Berger's wife. Bob Hoskins. Joanne Whalley Kilmer, and Corbin Bernsen.

Berenger works well as Dan Merrick: though acting in this offering won't sell the tickets. If anyone deserves credit for acting, it would be Hoskins for his part as Gus Klein, a pet shop owner cum-animal rights activist and part-time private investigator.
