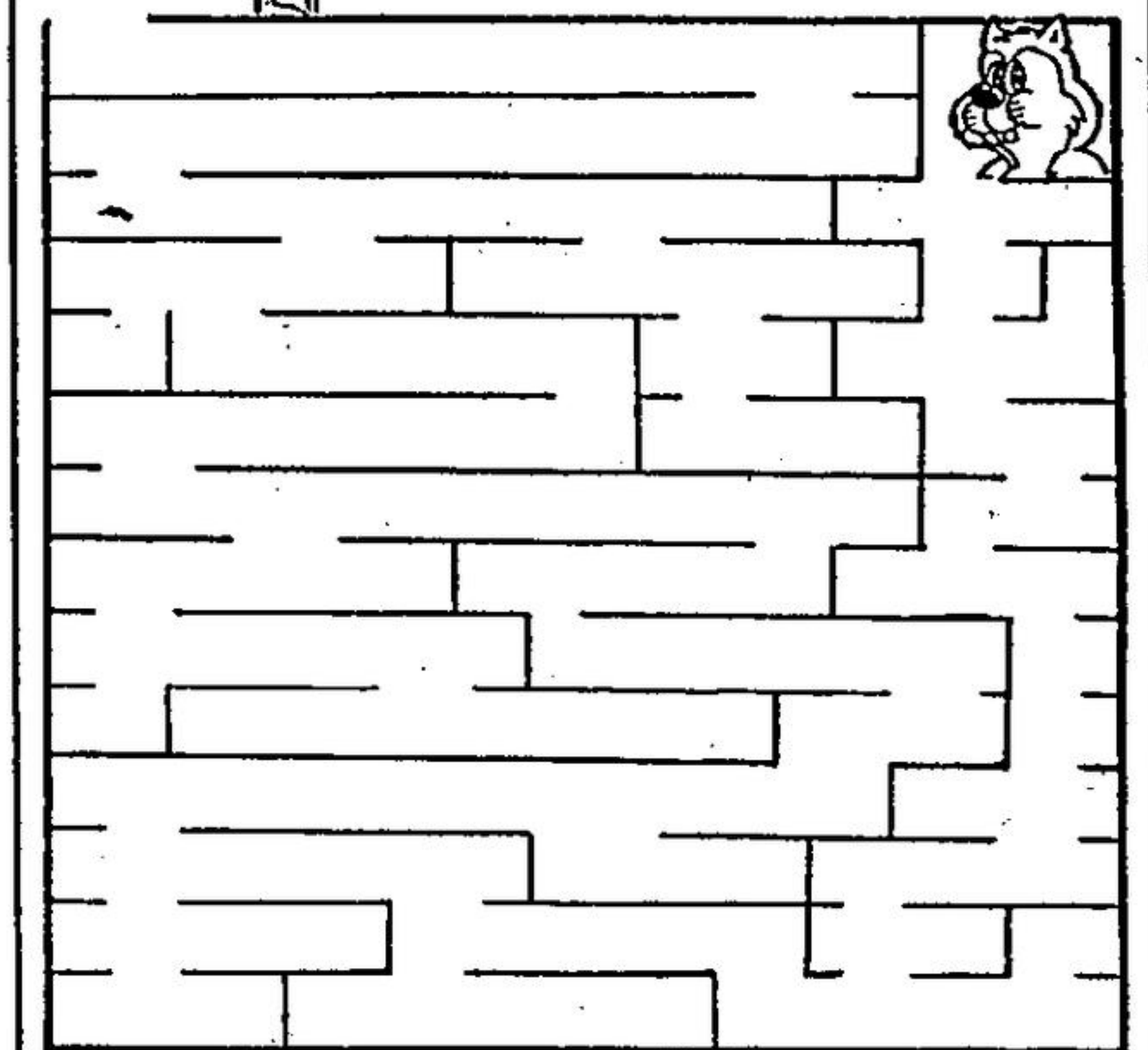
First frost: That special look a mother has when the kids leave coats and mitts strewn on the hallway floor.
