Measuring compassion, concern and commitment levels

First Sunday of Advent

Luke 21:25-28, 34-36 The year of Luke is a year for compassion, concern and commitment.

1. Compassion means to suffer with others.

2. Concern means to discern what is important, and to set one's priorities.

3. Commitment means to be engaged, to join with others.

If your compassion, concern commitment levels have been low lately, here are two tales. Lukan in style, which might rekindle your flame.

JENNIFER

The first is the story of a 15year old girl who lives near Toronto. Her story is told by means of ten questions that she thinks are the "Ten Best Questions in the World."

10. What teenage pressures did you have, and how do they differ from now?

JULIO

The second story is of Julio, a 31-year-old Uruguayan who is seeking refugee status in Canada. Julio left Uruguay in April of 1989 during the government of Strongman Stroessner. He's been living illegally in Canada since then. About six months ago he was convinced to enter the process to obtain official refugee status in Canada.

At present he's living in Toronto with his girlfriend and a threeweek-old baby.

He lines up every morning before 6:00 a.m. hoping to get a day of casual labor, that pays \$5.00 an hour.

He's also lined up for the Sit Program, designed by Immigration Canr la to assess refugee Julio will receive claimanteither a caim or an order of

Listen to his own testimony:

"In July 1987 I was elected general delegate of the food worker's union. This position made my situation in the company even more difficult and dangerous. The company offered me money and a better job if I abandoned my union activities. I could not sell my principles so I refused again. At this time the labour conflicts became acute and more dangerous.

"Employer and government united and acted together to stop the worker from making gains to improve their standard of living. better working conditions and

respect for human rights. We demanded that police brutality against the worker be stopped.

"The union president and general secretary were kidnapped and taken outside the capital, beaten and tortured for five days. Other union leaders disappeared without a trace, some appeared


