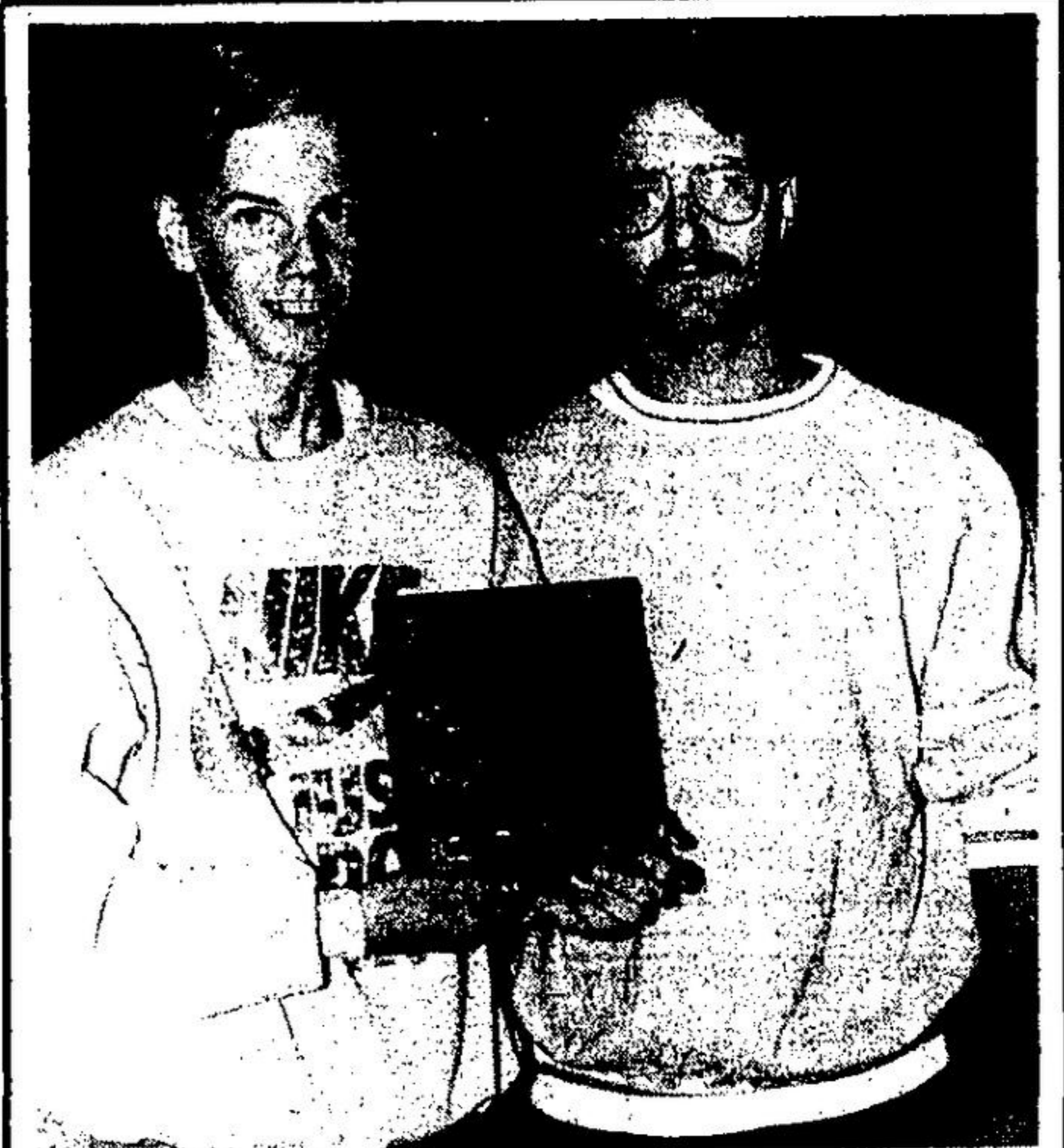
Prosport 'AA' atoms come up short

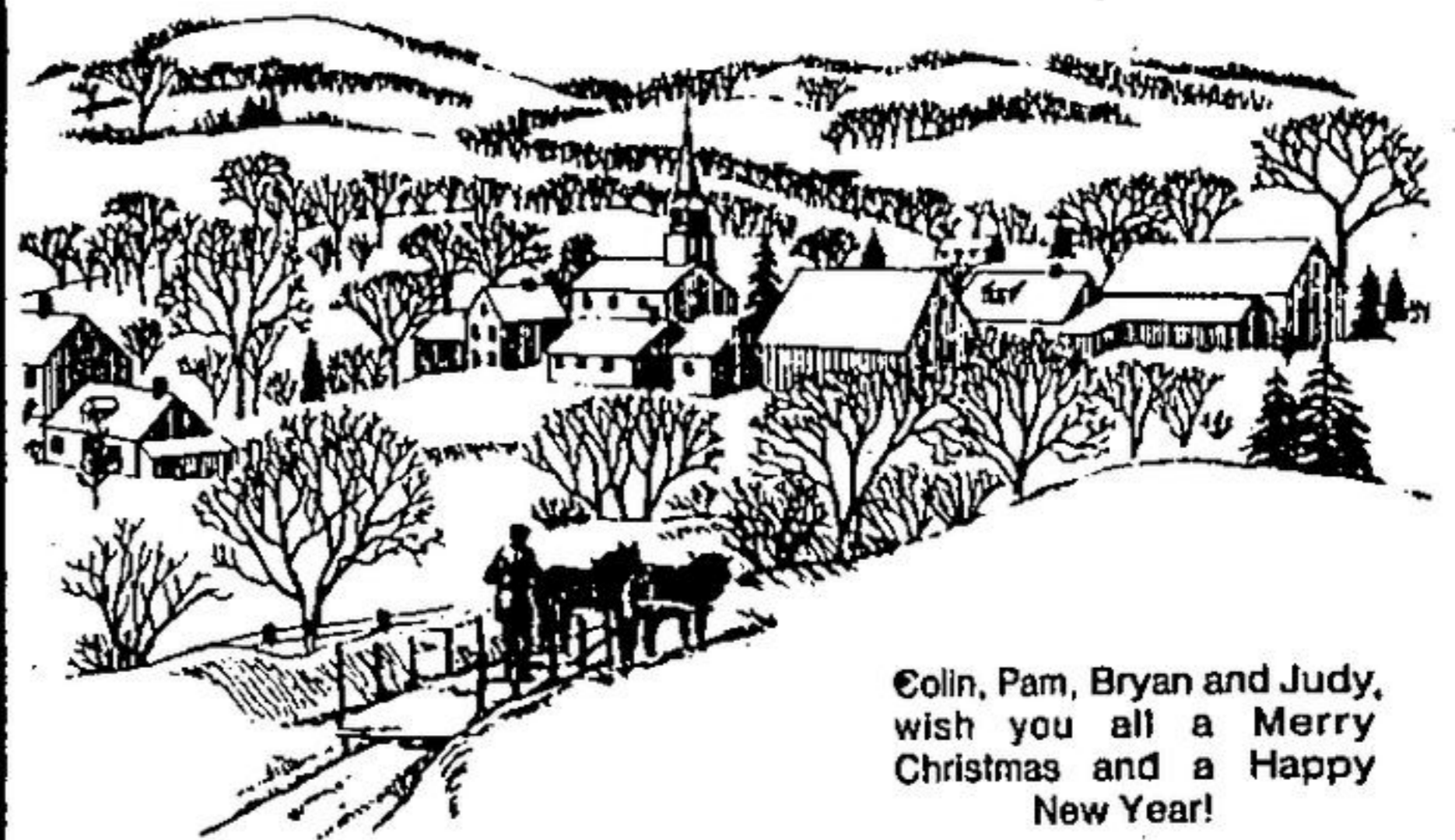


Bowling champ
