### Playing into the night

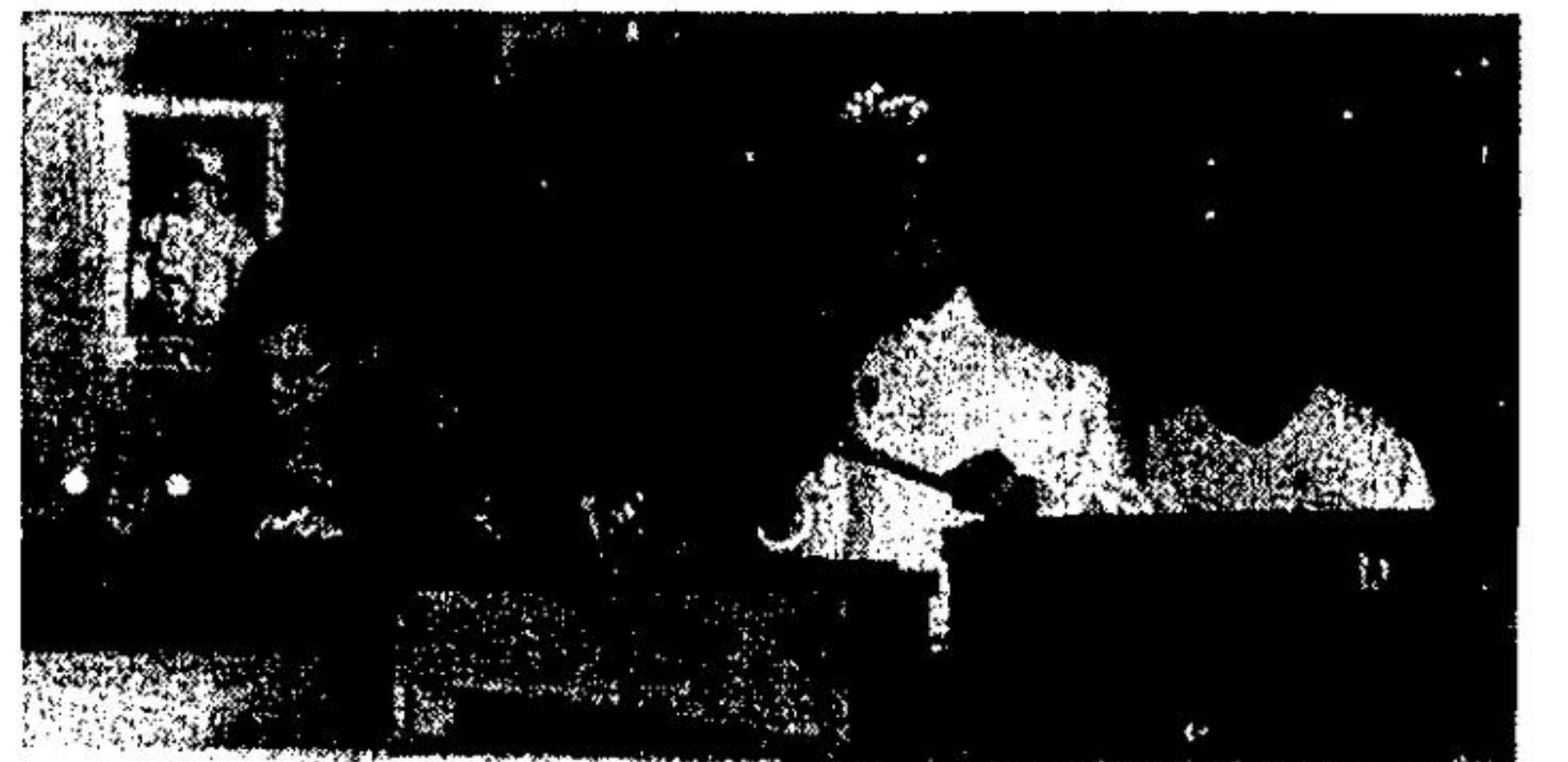
