

Sunny Acre Midgets score two victories

The Georgetown Sunny Acre Midgets continued their winning ways last week with two wins on the road, a 4-3 victory over Burlington and a 5-1 stomping over Chinguacousy.

In Burlington, the Georgetown crew were on fire for the first two periods, opening up a solid 4-0 lead.

Shawn Pearson and Dustin Thompson had first period goals. Pearson's second marker of the contest came from passes by Pirie and Justin Wees and Gary Dobbin's goal late in the second period came with help by Derek Ellard and Greg Dawson.

In the third, Georgetown's offensive effort simply disappeared and watched their lead decrease to a single goal. Their defence, however, was up to speed and with strong netminding by Josh Barber, managed to preserve the victory.

In Chinguacousy, the Sunny Acre squad gave a solid three period effort and enjoyed a great territorial edge throughout the game.

First period goals by Thompson and Pearson set the tone for the game. Tim Presswood and Justin Wees assisted on the goals. Ryan Pirie's goal early in the second from Derek Ellard had Georgetown firmly in command 3-0.

Chinguacousy appeared as if they might mount a comeback narrowing the margin 3-1 but Greg Dobbin's breakaway goal on a pass from Mike Large proved to be a heartbreaker.

Thompson's second goal midway through the third from Dobbin rounded out the scoring. Steady netminding by Tim Kingston ensured Sunny Acres' victory.

Two game split for Leaver Peewees

The Leaver Hurricane Peewees lost 4-2 Dec. 11 to Chinguacousy, then rebounded with a 5-2 victory over Barrie Dec. 13.

Scoring first for Halton in the Ching. game was Doug Janjevich who popped in a wrist shot on passes from Garry Garry McNiven and Tom Baynton. Ching. went ahead with two quick goals in the second to make it 2-1.

The Hurricanes evened things up in the third when Darin Finlayson took a pass from Jamie Walker behind the net and fired in a high backhand. Ching. was not to be outdone, however, and put the game away with two more goals later in the period.

The Dec. 13 game against Barrie was all Hurricanes as they coasted to a 5-2 win. Strong in net was Geoff Beauparlant who has been out of the lineup for over a month with a foot injury.

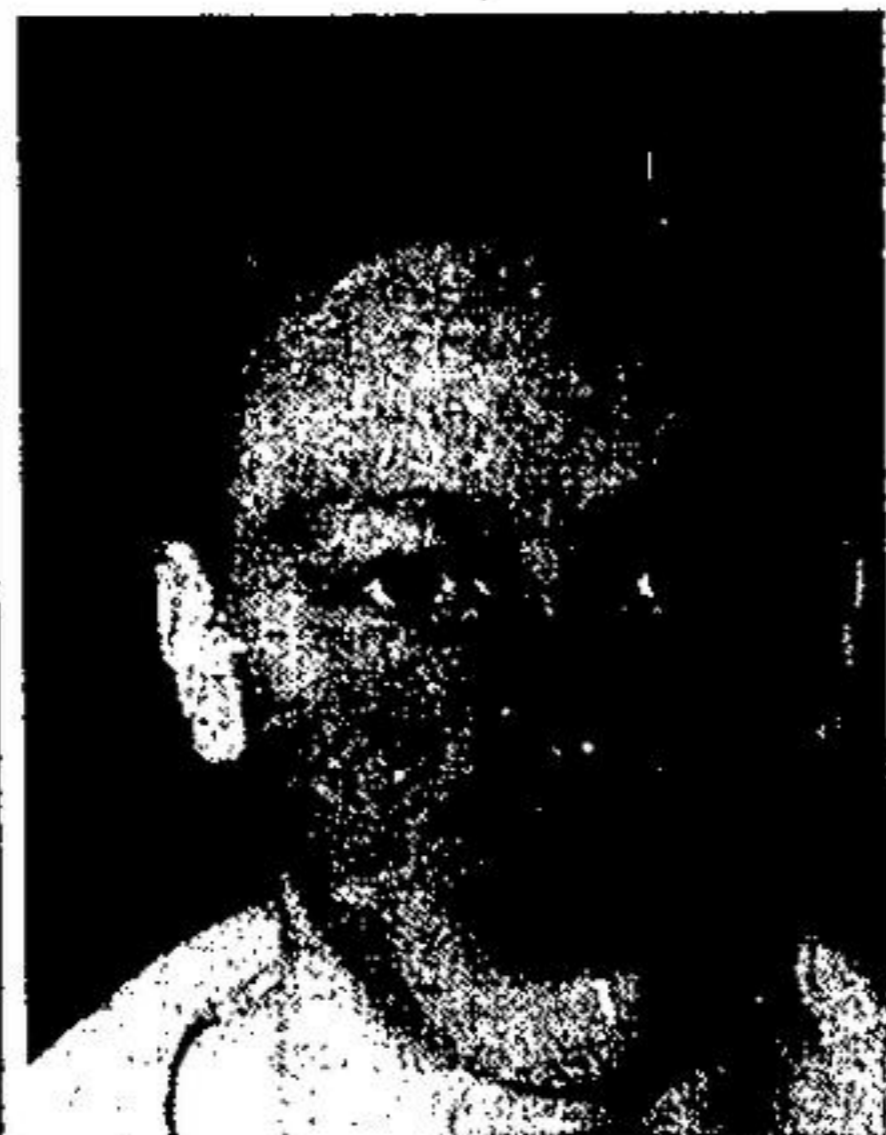

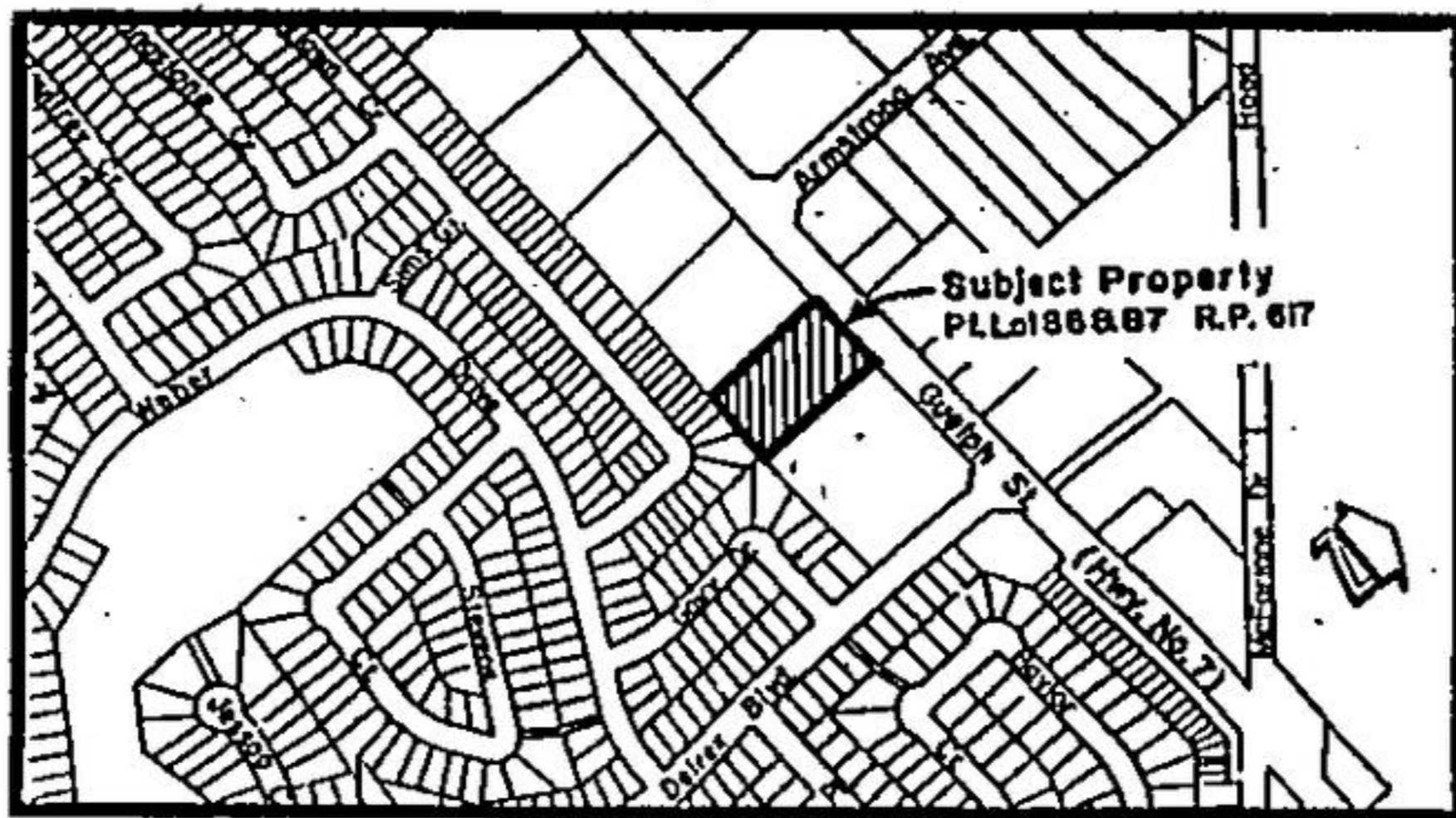

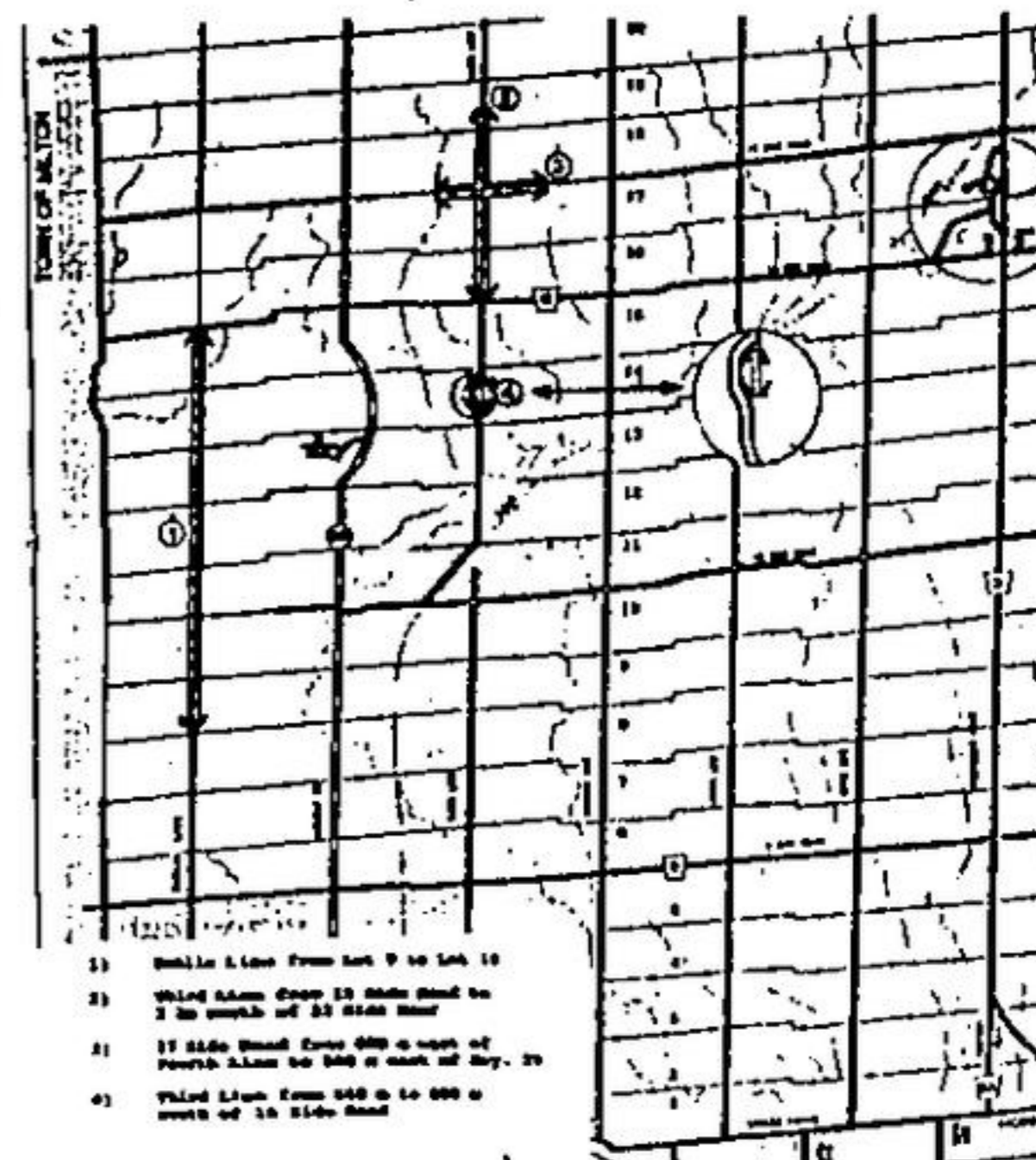
