

Police identify body found at Croation Centre

Halton Regional Police have identified the body found Sept. 6, in an equipment shed at the Croation Centre on Winston Churchill Boulevard in Norval, as that of 59-year-old Matt Mickilich of Charmaine Heights, Mississauga.

Halton Region Police Detective Sergeant Michael Eacrett said foul play is not suspected.

Mr. Mickilich's body was discovered by police Sept. 6, after police found an abandoned car at the Croation Centre. Police has linked the car to an accident which occurred Aug. 25, on Winston Churchill Boulevard.

He was reported missing to Peel Region Police by the family he had been living with for 21 years.

Investigators are trying to trace Mr. Mickilich's movements from Aug. 23.

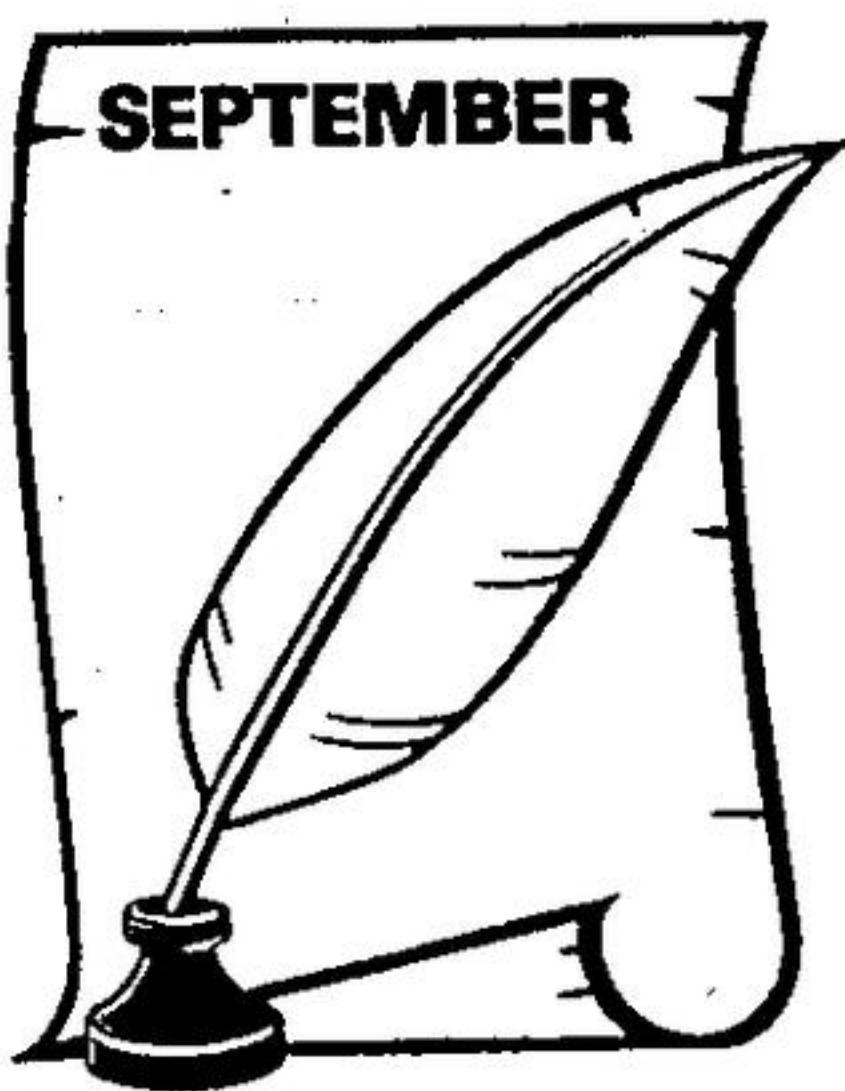
The Nov. 12 municipal elections are slowly heating up with candidates entering their names for council.
