1991 - The Year in Review

Protesters greet Premier with jeers and derision

Ontario Premier Bob Rae got a powerful surprise when he visited Georgetown, Dec. 9.

Protect Our Water and Environmental Resourses (POWER) protesters greeted Premier Rae with shouts and placards calling for his rejection of the Acton dump proposal, and jeered when he refused to answer to claims that he forgot his election promises.

He was in Georgetown to officially open the new engineering, research and technology centre at Mold-Masters on Armstrong Avenue, and approxiamately 20 protesters didn't miss the chance to address some of their concerns. They also asked the premier what he was doing to prevent the establishment of a dump on the Niagara Escarpment.

POWER protester, Rita Landry, complete with toilet seat around her head, asked "are you going to kill the dump or kill my kids?"

Premier Rae responded by laying the responsibility on the shoulders of Environment Minister, Ruth Grier.

After further calls for action, the premier responded by saying, "that is not my job." He said he does not have the authority but will bring the demonstration to the attention of Minister Grier.

"You have a responsibility to the environment and so does the government, but the government also has a responsibility to the process," said Premier Rae. "The process is always important. The government can't be seen to be or act arbitrarily."


After the premier left many protesters seemed disappointed

with his responses. "I've heard that rhetoric before," said Diane van de Valk. "Two years ago when he was here, Rae himself said it wasn't a suitable site for a landfill and there was no reason to go further with it. Now four years later, we're still fighting against

Two nurses have taken to barhopping to spread the message about AIDS. .

Public nurses Anne Todd and Julia Arnold visited O'Tooles in Georgetown to inform the public about AIDS (Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome).

As part of a new program by the Halton Health Department, Ms. Todd and Ms. Arnold, were handing



out colored condoms, and information in order to teach young people about the dangers of AIDS and how to protect themselves.

"The idea is to reach the group of people who typically haven't had any AIDS education in the school system," said Ms. Todd.

She said people in the 25 to 45 age group are the ones who aren't reached in the school system and that is where 75 per cent of the AIDS cases are.

"It's a great idea. What better place than here," said Wanda LeMay of Terra Cotta. "This is where spontaneous things often happen."

Although many patrons were enthusiastic about the program, some felt they had heard enough about AIDS.

"I don't think a lot of people who come to a bar want to talk about sexually transmitted diseases," said Jim O'Donnell of Georgetown.

Others thought people would feel intimidated or embarrassed to ask questions of nurses about AIDS.

To make the patrons feel more comfortable, Ms. Todd and Ms. Arnold set up a table with condoms and information and waited for people to come and talk. They dress casually and try to keep a relatively low-key profile.

Pamphlets entitled "Aids in the '90s - The New Facts of Life" and a quiz called "How Safe Are You?" were available at the booth the nurses set up in bars.
