Brampton scored minutes later but Halton answered almost immediately with a fine goal by Doug Janjevich. Brampton narrowed the gap just before the buzzer.

To start the second, the line of Janjevich, Steven Roy and Garry McNiven finished off a spectacular one, two, three passing effort that McNiven dumped in to take a 4-2 lead.

Peter Mashinter banged in a sharp, short slap shot on relays from Davis and Taylor to make it 5-2. Brampton then made it 5-3 before

Finlayson scored his second of the game to close off the scoring and ensure the victory for his team.

The Hurricane Peewees roughed up opponents in their next two contests, beating Oakville 5-1 Dec. 17 and dumping Burlington 5-1 Dec. 18. In both games, Halton gave up the first goal and stormed back to win.
