



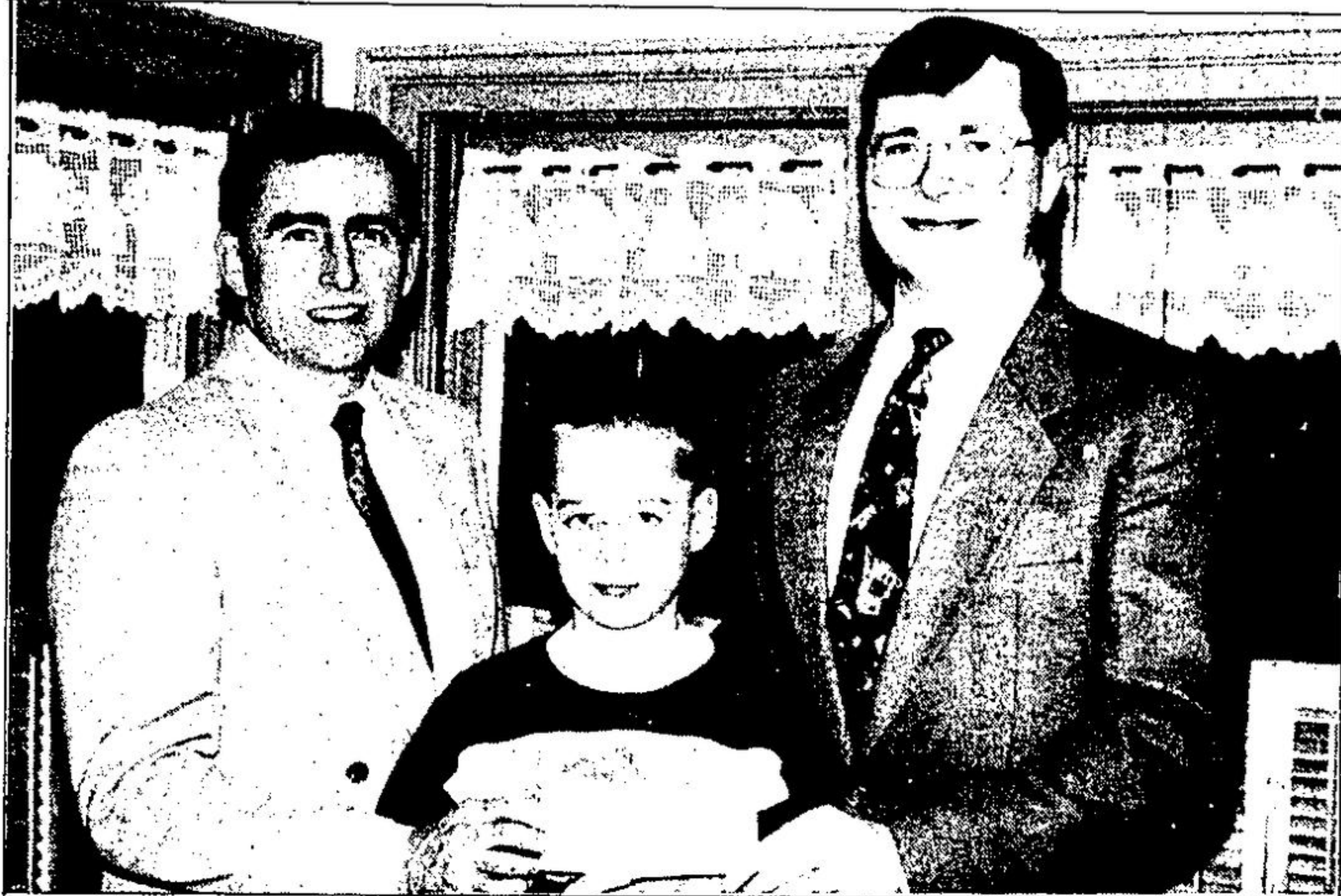
Rubbing noses
