Seatbelts do save lives

Today, 92.8 per cent of all Ontarians buckle up that's up from just 17.2 per cent who wore seatbelts before the mandatory law took effect.

Ontario was the first province to require all drivers and passengers to wear a seatbelt. The McGuinty government has since expanded the law to include:

- Increased fines for seatbelt, child seat, and booster seat violations
- A requirement that every vehicle occupant be buckled up - one person, one seatbelt
- The mandatory use of appropriate booster and child car seats at all times, whether children are

driving with a parent, grand parent or other caregiver.

Since Ontario's seatbelt law first came into effect in 1976, the number of people killed and injured in motor vehicle collisions has steadily dropped and it is estimated that seatbelt use has saved over 8,000

A driver who is not wearing a seatbelt is more than 40 times more likely to be killed in a crash than one who is properly buckled.

The fine for seatbelt, child seat, and booster seat violations is \$240 and two demerit points.


Please secure all open loads with a tarp or rope. All customers and visitors are to report to the Scalehouse upon arrival.

- over 150 kg 14.3 cents/kg starting from 0 kg





Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Depot

Household hazardous waste can injure waste collectors and can damage the environment if disposed of improperly. Household hazardous waste must not be put in the garbage or poured down the drain. Each year the HHW Depot recycles or properly disposes over 900,000 litres of household hazardous waste.



There is a 20 litre maximum per visit (residential loads only).

Salvation Army Reuse Depot

Drop-off unwanted reusable items free of charge and help the community:

- Backyard Composters: \$15 each (2 maximum)
