

> Council recently suggested the community meeting after it deferred voting on Tanners' request for an exemption. Neighbours complain that amplified music from Tanner's patio is an unwarranted intrusion of their right to enjoy their property.

Tanners' owner/operator Andrea Clark and her father Rick Matchett agreed to hire only "unplugged" artists, post signs in the neighbourhood cautioning bar patrons to be quiet, investigate noise abatement measures including insulation and speaker placement. During the trial, neighbour Penny McCabe will monitor the night time noise during weekend entertainment.
