Mayor Rick Bonnette who invited the Minister on a tour in a letter sent following Council's unanimous vote last Tuesday to grant Halton Healthcare Services \$2.6-million towards the project.

"You can now say the Town of Halton Hills has put our money where our mouth is to support this \$12.1-million project," Bonnette wrote, adding this would be the first expansion at the Georgetown facility since it was built in 1961, despite growth in the town.

This is Bonnette's fourth letter to the Minister in three months on the issue and he told the Minister last week that he "anxiously await(s) your reply."
