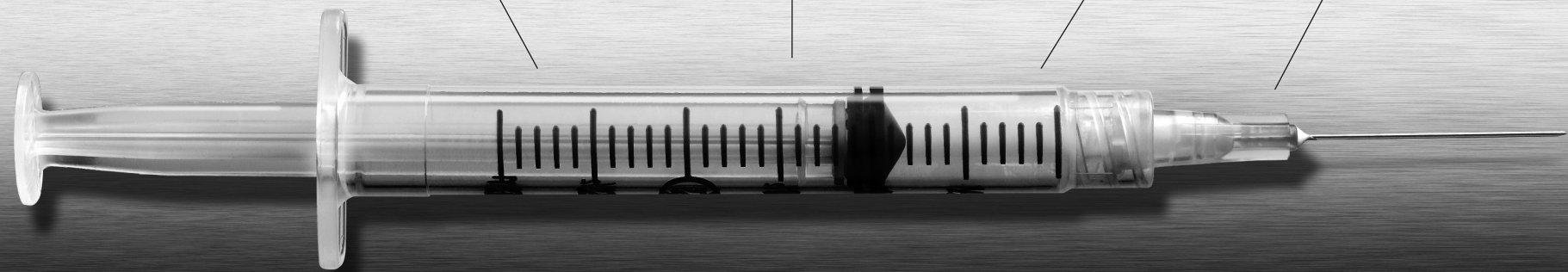
• At least 1 in 3 people could still get H1N1.
