Town of Halton Hills (Georgetown)

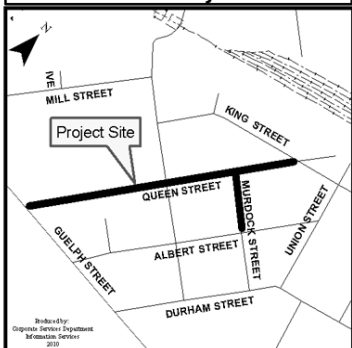
As part of our 2010 construction program the Town of Halton Hills is proposing road reconstruction sanitary sewer and waterline replacement Queen Street from Guelph Street to King Street and on Murdock Street from Queen Street to Albert Street in Georgetown. The work will include the following:

- Reconstruction of Queen Street and Murdock Street including new driving surface, curb and gutter and drainage improvements
- Sanitary sewer and water main construction on Queen Street and Murdock Street
- Removal of the concrete road base under Queen Street

A Public Information Centre will be held to provide residents with an opportunity to review the project drawings and to discuss any potential construction impacts that may result from the proposed works. Representatives from the Town of Halton Hills and Halton Region will be in attendance to answer any questions. The Public Information Centre is scheduled for:

Bach Chorale presents 'Cathedral Compositions' on Saturday

Imagine yourself 400-500 years back in a time when cathedrals were examples of architectural grandeur and beauty, with soaring spaces and stone walls designed to inspire awe in their congregants. These marvelous structures with their surreal resonance provided a perfect setting for the music that accompanied religious services and contributed in helping all people to forget, at least for a time, the hardships and mundanities of their daily life.

On Saturday, Feb. 6 at 8 p.m. the Georgetown Bach Chorale invites you to stop imagining and



actually experience "the sound of cathedrals". The Georgetown Bach Chorale and their guest, cellist Mary-Katherine Finch, will be presenting a concert of choral and instrumental chosen to advantage of the beautiful cathedral-like

acoustic features of the Croatian Catholic Church, located at the corner of Winston Churchill Boulevard and Embelton Road.

The music being performed is characterized by long, drawn out harmonies that swell and recede

through the space. The works being featured were composed as far back as the 11th century and as recently as the early 20th century. The concert includes among many breathtaking compositions, Lotti's *Crucifixus*, a solemn polyphonic work with organ-like chords that will highlight the Chorale's skill in performing eight-voice writing and Allegri's *Miserere*, one of the most sublime pieces of choral music ever written.

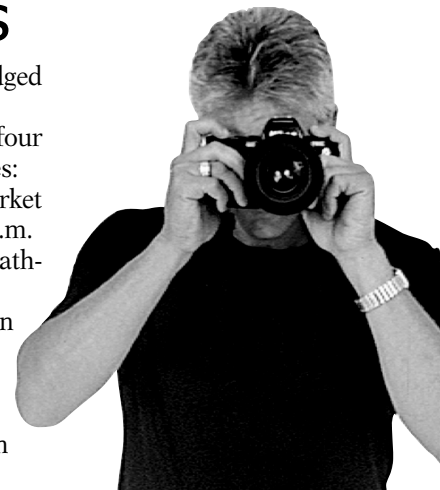

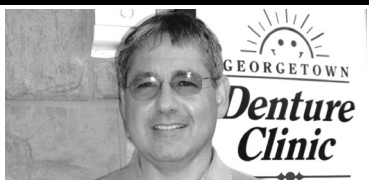
children's age categories, judged as under 8's or 9-12 year olds.

DENTURE CLEANING TIPS

- Fill the sink halfway with water so your dentures won't break if you drop them.
- Scrub dentures thoroughly. Ask your dentist for a special denture brush; it's short bristles clean sides and chewing surfaces and long bristles reach the narrow spaces inside. Soap and water work fine; baking soda removes stains. "Nova-dent" denture cleanser is an excellent cleaner and is available at our office.
- If you have partial dentures, clean their metal clasp carefully.
- If you find denture brushes hard to handle, try a nail brush for a better grip.
- Rinse dentures in clean water before returning them to your mouth.
- Remember to keep in touch with your dentist. Your mouth changes constantly - so from time to time, your dentures will need adjusting to maintain a good, comfortable fit. While reviewing the fit, your dentist will also examine your tissues, and review your home-care routine.

... Lend Me Your Ears

A diminished social life is one of the most difficult aspects of age related hearing loss. Many people avoid drawing attention to their hearing loss by having fewer social contacts when it becomes difficult understanding what is being said. The result is an altered and lonely existence that family and friends may mistake for dementia.

Learning new strategies to cope with hearing loss could go a long way to restoring confidence and improving communication.
