The Bearcat swim team members had impressive results at last week's meet at Georgetown District High School, with Valsamis finishing first in her heat for the junior girls' 50m backstroke. Ewing also placed first in a heat for the junior boys' 50m backstroke in a time of 50 seconds flat.

Georgetown District High School Athletes of the Week are swimmers Kristen Davison and John Paul Thomson. The 14-year-old Davison registered four top-four placings at last week's regional swim meet in Georgetown and is one of the team's most dedicated members, regularly making five or six practices a week. Thomson took five seconds off his personal best time for the 100m freestyle at the Georgetown meet and is on the verge of qualifying for OFSAA.

Christ the King Athletes of the Week are Brendan Krivec and Shayne Brown. Both play for the Jaguar varsity hockey team that recently captured its division championship at the annual Bur-Bear tournament in Burlington.
