The singers will spend a day in workshops and mass choir rehearsals, then perform in a concert with the renowned Jean Ashworth Bartle conducting.

Following that event, as the result of a second invitation, the Boys Choir of the Gaudeamus groups will head down to Oakville on Saturday, April 17 to participate in *Let the Boys Sing*, a festival hosted by the boy choir of the Oakville Children's Choir. The boys will

participate alongside the boy choir from the St. Michael's Choir School in Toronto, as well as the Amabile Boys Choir from London, and boys from other GTA choirs. The festival will feature guest conductor Michael Larkin from Ottawa, and performing in the final concert
