UCHS seeks funds to replenish Trooper's Fund for needy animals

The Upper Credit Humane Society's Trooper's Fund was founded in the name of Trooper, the lab cross who touched the hearts of so many as he battled his way back from 35 lbs and near starvation to living life to the fullest in the very happiest of homes.

Some of the animals that have been helped through the Fund are:

- Lava, the black Labrador Retriever. Just prior to going to his forever home he developed a baseball sized lump above his left eye. Diagnosis was an abscess which required draining, flushing, and sutures. He remained at the Shelter for an extra few weeks with a drainage shunt through his cheek.

- Chinook, the anorexic husky cross. He was diagnosed with pancreatitis. After a month of trial and error his medications and diet were blended and he started putting on weight.

- Mocha, the rabbit required an incisor extraction.

- Freddy (now Hunter), Gunner, and Jasper—the pointer puppies. Each one needed a different surgery after being rescued from a harrowing situation. One puppy needed hip surgery, one dental surgery (all had been eating wood) and one eye surgery.

- Genevieve was the cat that was shot with a pellet gun in the eye and specialized surgery not only saved her eye but took away the pain.

- Tyler, the cat came in as a dirty and matted stray. His teeth were infected and he required dental surgery.

- Chip needed teeth extracted
- Bella needed a tooth extracted
- Diesel required tibial plateau leveling

osteotomy surgery. This procedure alone cost \$2300+.

- Max arrived with a broken leg that had never been set but had already healed. He was hopping around on three legs and was in a lot of pain. After recuperating he can run in the park for as long as he likes and is a healthy, happy little guy.

- Demetrius was found with his sister on the side of a road in January. She was fine, but Demetrius had injuries to both his front and back legs. Although the front leg healed without medical care, his back leg required pinning the bone to repair the fracture.
