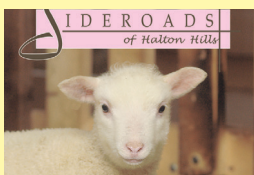

Squad wins tourney after teammate hurt in crash **Team triumphs despite tragic circumstances**

A bantam house league hockey team from Georgetown has dedicated its victory at a tournament in St. Catharines last week to a critically injured teammate.

Fifteen-year-old Jeffrey Boorman suffered life-threatening injuries, including trauma to the head, after the Ford Expedition his 45-year-old father Doug was driving last Wednesday morning was struck by a Chrysler Cirrus making a sudden lane change, police say.

Burlington OPP say a 45-year-old Hamilton woman was driving the Cirrus.

The accident occurred on the Niagara-bound lanes of the QEW at Stoney Creek at around 8:30 a.m. as the Georgetown residents were traveling to a March Break minor hockey tournament in St. Catharines.

Boorman is in the intensive care unit of Hamilton General Hospital in critical condition.

His teammate on the Georgetown Minor Hockey Association bantam white Scotiabank squad, Chris Roach, was not injured, while Doug Boorman was treated for minor injuries and released from hospital.
