Georgetown Lions Club members will be going door to door over the next few weeks, handing out flyers, food bags and encouraging residents to attend a special Pancake Breakfast Weekend, April 10-11.

"With the increase in demand at the Georgetown Bread Basket this year, the Georgetown Lions Club is 'springing' into action," said Lion Jack Ruck, a breakfast organizer, adding this event is in keeping the Lions' motto 'To Serve'.

The Lions will be offering a full breakfast and joint food drive, 7 a.m. to noon, on Saturday and Sunday at the Lions Club of Georgetown Hall, 42 Mill St. (behind Memorial Arena).



The breakfast of bacon, ham, eggs,

pancakes, toast, coffee, tea and juice, is free with a donation to the Georgetown Bread Basket food bank. Donations can be in the form of food/toiletry items or monetary donations.

Marian Viant of the Bread Basket says the food bank is currently very low on cold cereal, sugar, powdered milk, flour and coffee.

The Georgetown Lions have been part this community since 1931, organizing the first Santa Claus Parade in 1933. Over the years the organization has supported such local projects as Georgetown Hospital, the Gellert Centre, Devereaux House, minor sports, and the annual Citizen of the Year.

CHANGES ON THE GO

Starting April 3, 2010, GO Transit is making several system-wide service changes to bring schedules in line with actual travel times and to meet the changing needs and demands of our growing ridership.

31 – Georgetown GO Train & Bus

The westbound 2:45 p.m. train from Union Station will now depart at 3:30 and times will be later at all stops along the route. The trip will be extended to also serve Mount Pleasant and Georgetown.

The westbound 6:45 p.m. train from Union will be extended to serve Mount Pleasant at 7:36. A connecting bus is available to Georgetown. With this change, the westbound 6:30 p.m. bus trip from Union to Mount Pleasant and the 6:35 bus trip from Union to Georgetown will no longer operate.

The eastbound 10:25 a.m., 12:15 p.m. and 1:45 train trips from Bramalea to Union and the connecting bus trips will no longer operate. The westbound 9:40, 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. trains from Union to Bramalea and the connecting bus trips will no longer operate.

These train trips will be replaced with 22 bus trips providing more frequent service. There will also be changes to bus trips that connect to train service including the **37-Orangeville GO Bus** and **38-Bolton-Hwy. 50 GO Bus routes**.

34 – Brampton Local, Hwy. 27 & 427 GO Bus

The weekday eastbound 3:00 p.m., 4:00 and 5:00 trips from Brampton to York Mills will no longer operate.
