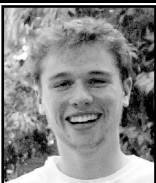

McCracken, who will play at York University next year, was the setter for the Rebel senior girls' volleyball team that earned silver medals at the provincial AAAA championships in Barrie. Oles earned silver medals in the 100m individual medley and 50m breaststroke, along with a bronze for the GDHS 200m IM relay team at the Ontario finals recently in Etobicoke.

Christ the King Athletes of the Week are Brandon Clelland and Dylan Hannan. Clelland, a Grade 10 centre and captain on the Jaguar junior boys' hockey team, was Ctk's MVP at the recent Burlington Cup and Motown Cup tournaments. 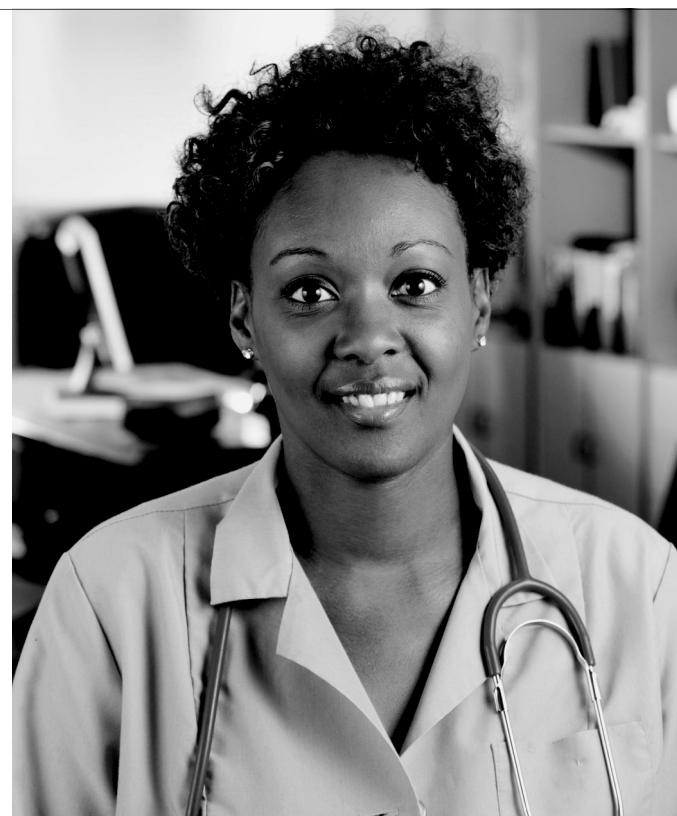
