Notice of Halton Region's 2010 Comprehensive Employment Survey

Halton Region is initiating a Comprehensive Employment Survey in 2010. The data collected will be vital to monitor the Region's economic health, as well as to aid in decision and policy making. It is essential background information for forecasting and planning the Region's infrastructure and services for the residents and businesses of Halton.

Between May and September 2010, a team of surveyors from the Region's Planning Services Division **will visit each and every business establishment in Halton** to gather information about the number of employees working at each location and the type of employment that is taking place there. The surveyors will wear a Halton Region shirt and cap, each bearing the Halton Region logo, as well as a visible photo ID card that identifies them as part of the "Halton Employment Survey Team 2010." Your individual business information will not be identifiable nor published in the results of the survey. All data collected from the survey will be grouped together and only be released to the public as statistical highlights of economic patterns and trends.


