

Centennial Chargers take first at Ortwein track/field meet

Centennial Public School's Chargers from Georgetown captured the overall team championship title recently at the Halton District School Board's Ortwein Track & Field Meet in Burlington.

The meet consisted of the biggest schools by population in Halton for grades 6-8.

The Chargers took top spot in the intermediate girls' and boys' categories, just nine points ahead of the Stewarttown Middle School Stingers, who won the senior girls' and boys' team pennants.

Centennial's intermediate girls' 4x100m relay team, consisting of Stephanie Bowen, Pauline Robson, Lauren Rock and Hailey Buist, set a new Halton record time in one of the heats of 55.40 seconds, then raced to victory in the final in 55.46, 2.52 seconds ahead of the runners-up.

McKenzie-Smith Bennett of Acton also sent several athletes to the meet and Alex Denny earned first place in the senior boys' shot put.
