NOTICE OF STUDY COMMENCEMENT & PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE #1

**Trafalgar Road (Regional Road 3) Short-Term Intersection and Operations Review
Trafalgar Road (Regional Road 3) from Steeles Avenue (Regional Road 8)
to Highway 7, Town of Halton Hills**

Study

Halton Region is initiating a Short-Term Intersections and Operations Review in order to address existing and short-term (1-5 year) operational needs along the Trafalgar Road (Regional Road 3) corridor from Steeles Avenue (Regional Road 8) to Highway 7. As part of this study a number of road improvement alternatives will be examined, including: auxiliary lanes (left and right turn lanes), signal upgrades and timing plan adjustments, pavement rehabilitation, improvements to signage and pavement markings as well as improvements to traffic control.

Background

In March 2009, Halton Region issued a "Notice of Study Cancellation" for the ongoing Class Environmental Assessment (EA) Study for Trafalgar Road from No. 10 Sideroad to Highway 7. The purpose of this Class EA Study was to address future long-term transportation planning needs in the corridor. However, several other planning studies were initiated by Halton Region and other levels of government that had the potential to impact or influence the Trafalgar Road Class EA Study. These other studies include: Halton Transportation Master Plan Update to 2031, Halton/Peel Boundary Area Transportation Study and GTA West Corridor Study.

As a result, the Trafalgar Road Class EA Study was cancelled and no further long-term planning assessment will be undertaken until the above noted studies have been completed and there is a better understanding of how the Trafalgar Road corridor and the transportation needs in the Town of Halton Hills will be affected. Long-term planning solutions will be the subject of a separate future study. However, in the short-term, in order to address current operational concerns along Trafalgar Road, a commitment has been made to undertake a short-term intersection and operations review along the Trafalgar Road corridor from Steeles Avenue to Highway 7.

Process

This notice signals the commencement of the Trafalgar Road Short-Term Intersection and Operations Review. A key component of the study will be consultation with interested stakeholders including the public, interest groups and regulatory agencies. The study will include two Public Information Centres (PICs). The PICs will provide stakeholders with an opportunity to meet with the Project Team, understand the study scope and discuss issues related to the project including alternative solutions, environmental considerations and evaluation criteria. This notice also advises stakeholders of the first PIC.

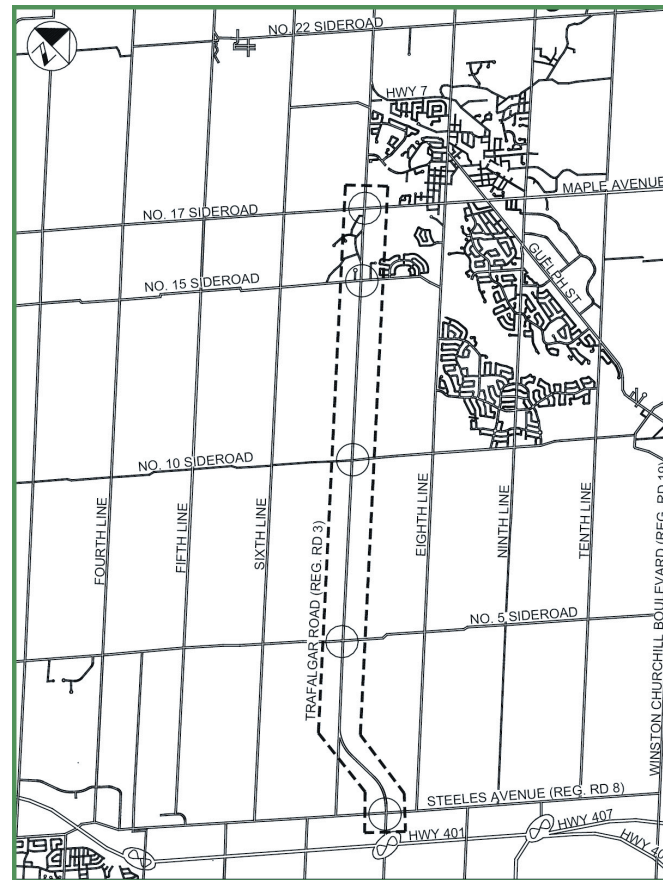
