## Raiders, Rangers affiliate

The Georgetown Jr. A Raiders announced last week that they have reached an affiliation agreement for the 2010-2011 season with the Ontario Hockey League's Kitchener Rangers.

Previously, the Raiders held an affiliation with the OHL's Owen Sound Attack under coach and general manager James Richmond, who left to take over the Aurora Tigers.

He was replaced by former Sarnia Sting assistant coach Greg Walters in March.

"The Rangers have a proud tradition both on and off the ice and we look forward to developing their prospects," Walters said.
