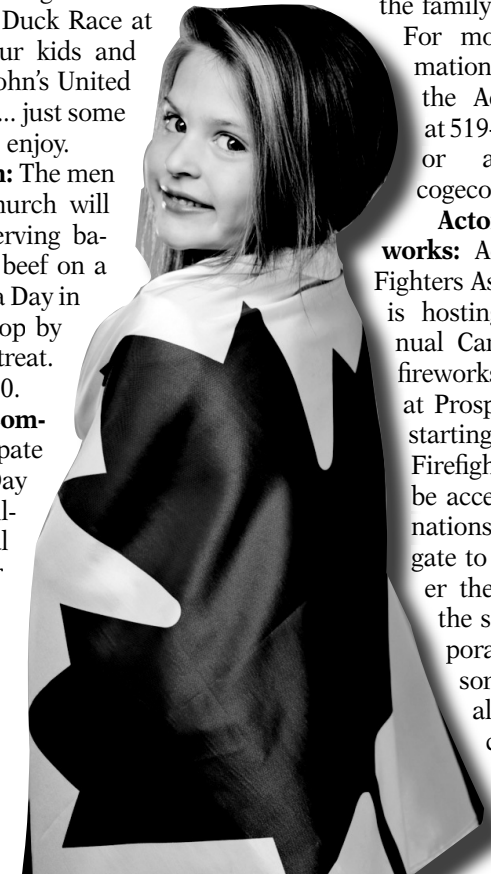
The Town of Halton Hills is seeking individuals to serve on the Halton Hills Municipal Compliance Audit Committee.

Q: July 1, Canada day, falls on a Thursday this year. What can I offer my employees? No problem when a public holiday falls on a weekend or a Monday - but what about when it's a Thursday?

A: A recent pole conducted by the A:HRPA indicated 68% of Employers are taking the Thursday, 19% are taking the Thursday and Friday and 13% are moving the holiday to Friday. Most employees have the right to get the public holiday off and get paid public holiday pay. However, if an employee agrees *in writing* to work on the public holiday, there are two options:
 1) The employee is entitled to receive regular wages for all hours worked on the public holiday, plus a substitute day off with public holiday pay.
 2) The employee agrees *in writing*, he or she is entitled to public holiday pay for the public holiday plus premium pay for all hours worked on the public holiday. In this case, the employee will not be given a substitute day off.
