Public gets first chance to share views on \$2B transportation plan

A transportation master plan to accommodate growth where more than 17 billion new residents will move over the next 20 years will be the subject of public hearings over the next week, including two in Georgetown.

Georgetown Mayor Doug Ford said, "The Road to Change," the master plan will include secondary road expansions, bridge and overpass modifications and new bus lanes that will be built to accommodate the growth. The plan also aims to date the next expansion projects in the region. The Road to Change will be developed by a regional transportation master plan developed in 2007. That plan has matured since 2007 and is available online at www.halton.ca/masterplan.

A public information centre is set tomorrow (Thursday, Aug. 26) at the Georgetown Community Complex (The Hall), 221 Guelph Line, Georgetown, from 6:30 a.m. with a presentation at 7:30 a.m.

As of December 31, the Region of Halton will have spent \$461.4 million for roads projects, including the \$200 million for the 2007-08 budget. This year's budget includes \$100 million for roads and \$380 million more is included in the 2010-11 budget forecast for 2011-12. About \$1.2 billion is expected to be needed for the 2020-2031 time period, according to the master plan. For more information, the vast majority of that master will be spent on secondary roads, which will require significant increases to the existing network of roads in the region. The plan is working by Halton residents, business leaders and staff.
