Volunteer firefighters are professionals who work on a part-time, usually on-call basis. If they sometimes work in the shadow of their full-time colleagues, their contribution to public safety still plays a vital role in society. In fact, being a volunteer firefighter is not always easy; time must be consecrated to a principal source of income while remaining completely available for when an emergency arises. The majority of the Halton Hills Fire Department's 90 part-time firefighters work for the Town of Halton Hills.

The selection process for volunteer firefighters, though different from that of full-time firefighters, is still very rigorous which means the population is in good hands. Not everyone can become a volunteer firefighter — basic training is the same as it is for their full time colleagues. In order to be a part-time firefighter in Halton Hills, candidates must pass written and physical aptitude tests, an interview, health and fitness evaluations, and a probationary period.

What is surprising about this profession is that it brings together different people from different walks of life, who have in common a highly developed sense of duty and altruism to the point of putting their own lives in danger. It is a very dirty and demanding job, but for those who have what it takes, it is a job like no other.
