### Police issue computer warning

Halton Police are warning area residents of the dangers of using unsecured wireless Internet connections in their homes.

While wireless computer connections are convenient and make for more flexible accessibility to the Web, police warn however that if a person's router is not secure, they could be leaving their entire network susceptible to infection or data theft.

Police say anyone who doesn't have password protection or encryption for their home network, could potentially allow someone to utilize their router to get into their system, or hijack their signal to get onto the Internet.

To ensure a home wireless network is secure from unauthorized access police recommend area residents consider following these security recommendations:

- Change default administrator passwords (and usernames)
- Consider turning on wireless encryption
  - Change the default SSID
  - Disable SSID broadcast
  - Enable MAC address filtering
- Enable firewalls on each computer and the router
- Turn off the network during extended periods of non-use

A person's Internet provider or router manufacturer can supply more detailed instructions on how to protect their network.
