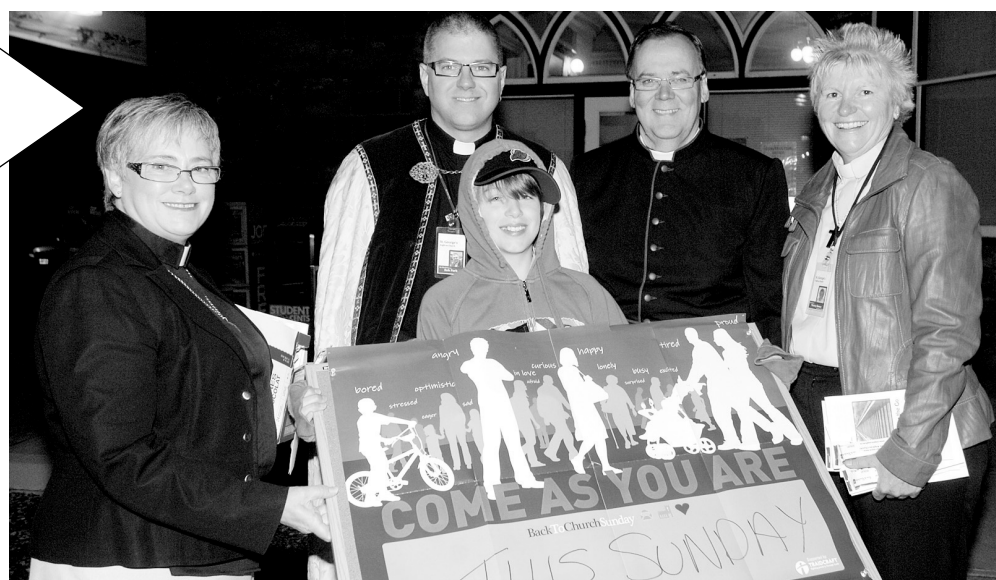

win one of many prizes generously donated by local businesses (including Leafs tickets, free coffee for a year at Tim Horton's, 42" Samsung HD TV, etc).

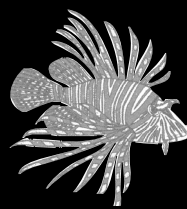

ATTENTION BOATERS:

THERE ARE CHANGES IN APPLYING FOR A PLEASURE CRAFT LICENCE

Did you know that any pleasure craft powered by 10 hp (7.5 kW) or more must have a valid licence? A pleasure craft licence allows search and rescue personnel and other agencies to quickly identify your boat in the event of an emergency.

As of **November 1, 2010**, to get your free pleasure craft licence, you must **mail** the following documents to the Pleasure Craft Processing Centre:

1. a completed application form;
2. proof of vessel ownership; and
3. a signed copy of a valid piece of government-issued identification. (Further information is available on the form.)
