

Are you using **acceptable GreenCart liners**?

If you choose to line your GreenCart with a bag, please ensure you are using and purchasing **acceptable GreenCart liners**. Not all liners sold are accepted for use in Halton's GreenCart program. **Halton Region does not accept plastic products or plastic liners in the GreenCart.**



If purchasing liners, ensure you only select certified compostable liners with the Biodegradable Products Institute (BPI) logo on the box, as shown to the right. These bags are made from plant-based materials so they compost easily.



Other acceptable liners include:

- Paper towels
- Newspaper/flyers
- Cardboard
- Paper bags
- Paper food waste bags
