## Haiti Heroes hailed

Healing Hands for Haiti International was recently recognized by Physicians for Peace as one of its 'Haiti Heroes'.

The Haiti Heroes award was presented to local resident Eric Doubt, executive director of the organization and Lisa Bagley, Certified Rehabilitation Registered Nurse, a founding member for the organization's work in Haiti.

The recipients are selected based on outstanding service and shared interest and collaboration with Physicians for Peace in Haiti.

The awards were handed out last month at the Fifth Annual Celebrate the Nations Gala Reception in Virginia Beach.

Healing Hands for Haiti delivers physical medicine and rehabilitation services to the more than 800,000 adults and children living with disabilities in Haiti. Its facilities were almost completely destroyed in the earthquake in January.

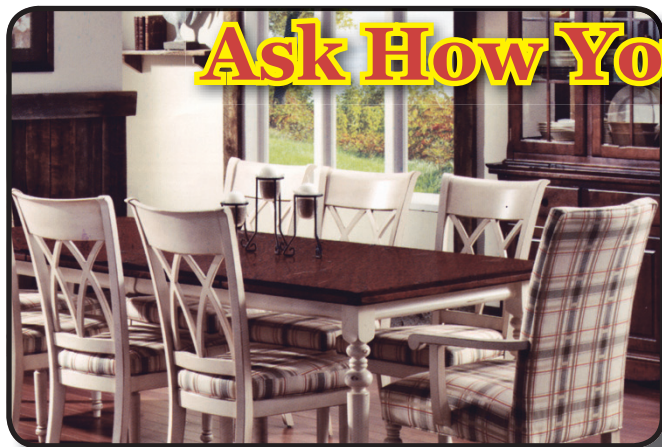
Since the quake, Healing Hands for Haiti International (HHHI) has deployed more than 300 medical volunteers from across North America including new International Board mem-

ber Karen McKenzie-Stepner of Halton Hills Speech Centre, to assist in medical rehabilitation efforts across Haiti. It has fabricated and fitted more than 350 limbs for amputees and more than 150 orthotic devices for disabled patients, provided experts to assist in the care of more than 100 spinal cord injured patients, reestablished all programs and services to orphanages, hospitals and in temporary medical and prosthetic fabrication facilities while beginning construction of a new \$3 million Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation Institute in Port-au-Prince.
