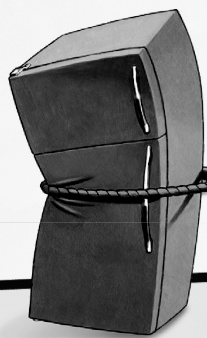

McGibbon Hotel

The McGibbon Hotel, was originally built by Robert Jones and was sold to Thomas Clark in about 1867. A double veranda graced the Main and Mill Street sides of the building until the hotel was ravaged by fire in the 1880's. After the fire a third floor was added to a part of the building. The hotel, situated in the heart of downtown Georgetown's business district at 79 Main Street South.



The current home of the olde Hide House was built in 1899. It took more than half a million bricks and hundreds of 18-inch thick solid wood columns to construct the Eastern Ave. landmark. Originally built as a warehouse for the Beardmore tannery, the Eastern Avenue building continued to serve that purpose for several decades.
