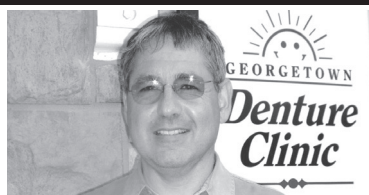

Thinking of our Comrades who are under the weather/and or shut-ins, please know we think of you often.

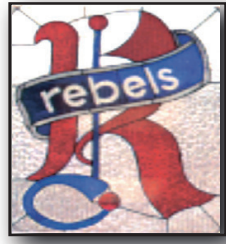
Food drive at Marketplace Dental Centre
