The first candle represents our grief and pain of losing you. It reminds us of the depth of love we have for you.


The second candle represents our courage to confront our sorrow and to comfort each other for our loss, the change our lives will have without you in it.

Alcoa to Jesse's Journey

A \$1,500 donation was made to the Jesse's Journey Foundation, named after Jesse Davidson, a London man who lost his life to the disorder last year at age 29. The local-area offshoot of Jesse's Journey, Eric's Amazing Race, was a car rally held Nov. 6 through the Flamborough/Halton countryside, which is dedicated to 10-year-old DMD patient Eric Morden of Oakville.
