

Police blotter: Gas station robbed

Halton Police are investigating a robbery at the Petro Canada gas station on Steeles Ave. Wednesday.

Police say shortly before midnight a man walked into the gas station and went to the counter where a lone male employee was standing.

The suspect ordered the attendant to open the cash register, a weapon wasn't seen but the suspect kept a hand in one of his pockets and the employee felt he was concealing a weapon.

Once the cash register was opened the suspect reached over and removed an undisclosed quantity of cash. He also took some lottery tickets before leaving the store.

He was last seen walking north. The employee wasn't injured.

The suspect is described as white, 6', 200 lbs. He was wearing a red long-sleeved sweater, black pants with a yellow stripe and a black wool hat.

Plans to move six massive fermentation tanks from the Hamilton Port Authority lands to the Molson Coors Brewery near Pearson Airport were put on hold for a third time.

Mark Sandrock, who oversees operations of oversized freight for Challenger Motor Freight Inc., said ongoing engineering problems have delayed the 40-vehicle convoy until at least the middle of this week.

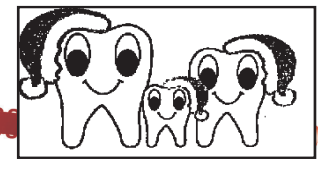
The move, which was planned take place over four consecutive nights to minimize traffic congestion, requires partial road closures and temporary removal of hydro wires and traffic lights.

Police officers from five jurisdictions were to accompany the 45-tonne tanks on the 108-kilometre trip from the port to the brewery. Part of the trip would see the convoy travel along Trafalgar Rd. and Steeles Ave. in Halton Hills.
