
# Annual tourney renamed to honour Bob Goldham

# Raiders struggle against Hawks, Otters

The Georgetown Raiders head into the Ontario Jr. Hockey League's holiday break with an old foe suddenly breathing down their necks.

With a 4-4 record in their past eight games, the second-place Raiders completed the 2010 segment of the regular season with a home date against the Oakville Blades, who had won seven straight games heading into Wednesday evening's contest and were just four points back of Georgetown with a game in hand.

Turning in a full 60-minute effort remains a problem for the Raiders, who were beaten 4-3 in a shootout last Friday by the last-place 5-28-3 IceHawks in Milton. Tyler Walsh (2) and Justin Basso had the visitors' goals.

On Saturday night at home, the Raiders grabbed a 3-0 first-period lead over the Huntsville Otters, only to give up

four straight goals in a six-minute span in the second period to fall behind. Joshua Burnell's second marker of the night late in the final frame rescued a 5-4 win for Georgetown, with Basso, Travis Fulton and Brock Labelle adding singles.

Head coach and general manager Greg Walters made another trade this week, sending feisty forward Michael Cappuccino to the Villanova Knights for third-year Jr. A defender Nathan Domagala, an Oakville resident.

The 6-foot, 195-pound 18-year-old had three goals and 24 assists in 34 games with the Knights this year.

The Raiders begin the new year with a pair of tough road games, on Jan. 2 against the OJHL West Division-leading Burlington Cougars, who are up eight points on Georgetown, followed the next night with a trip to Hamilton to face the Red Wings.
