

The Halton Waste Management Site (HWMS) provides Halton residents with a convenient "one stop" location for reuse, recycling and proper waste disposal.

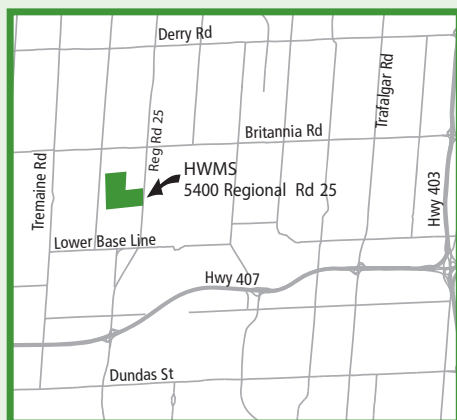
**Please secure all open loads with a tarp or rope. All customers and visitors are to report to the Scalehouse upon arrival.**

## Fees

For general waste and use of the Container Station, the user fees are:

- up to 50 kg – \$5/load
- 51 kg -150 kg – \$10/load
- over 150 kg – 14.3 cents/kg starting from 0 kg

## Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Depot

Household hazardous waste can injure waste collectors and can damage the environment if disposed of improperly. Household hazardous waste must not be put in the garbage or poured down the drain. Each year the HHW Depot recycles or properly disposes over 900,000 litres of household hazardous waste.



**There is a 20 litre maximum per visit (residential loads only).**

## Container Station

In addition to garbage disposal, the following materials are collected and diverted from landfill:



**Appliances**  
(\$5 per appliance)



**Drywall**



**Scrap metal**



**Wood**



**Yard waste**

**Additional items may be diverted at the Container Station free of charge:**



**Blue Box recyclables** (free for residential loads only; commercial loads are subject to charge)



**GreenCart organics** (free for residential loads only)



**Cell phones**



**Eye glasses**



**Electronics** (computers, monitors, TVs, stereos, DVD players, etc.) (up to five pieces per load)



**Printer cartridges**



**Tires** (up to five tires per load)



**Wine and champagne bottle corks** (natural corks only)

## Paint & Stain Reuse Depot

Looking to repaint your house? Pick up and drop off usable paint and stain at the Paint & Stain Reuse Depot for free. The Paint & Stain Reuse Depot is conveniently located beside the Household Hazardous Waste Depot and is open from spring to fall. The HWMS cannot guarantee the availability of colours or quantities.



## Salvation Army Reuse Depot

Drop-off unwanted reusable items free of charge and help the community:

- ✓ **Acceptable Materials:** clothing, linens, paired shoes, kitchenware, certain toys, books, working computers, TVs and undamaged furniture.
- ✗ **Unaccepted Materials:** cabinets, desks, typewriters, tires, auto parts, mattresses, infant equipment (cribs, etc.) and console TVs.



## Blue Boxes, GreenCarts & Backyard Composters

Blue Boxes, GreenCarts and Backyard Composters are available at the **Scalehouse**.

- **Blue Boxes:** new residents two free of charge, current residents one free of charge per year, \$5 per additional box (3 maximum)
- **GreenCarts:** new residents one free of charge, additional carts \$15 each (2 maximum). Exchange broken GreenCarts at the Scalehouse.
- **Backyard Composters:** \$15 each (2 maximum)
