Region issues tattoo warning

The Region has received reports that residents are getting pierced and tattooed in un-inspected facilities, including private homes, which can pose increased health risks.

"Tattooing and piercing in un-inspected establishments can increase the risk of skin and blood-borne infections, including HIV and hepatitis B and C," said Dr. Bob Nosal, medical officer of health. He said individuals should ask to see proof of a recent health inspection before getting under needle.

Those considering a tattoo or piercing should ensure that: operators clean their hands and wear gloves; new sterile needles are used and equipment is appropriately cleaned and sterilized after each client; skin is appropriately cleaned and disinfected before tattooing or piercing; the artist does not re-dip the utensils into ink that has been



used on other people; only jewelry made of high-grade, sterile, surgical steel or gold is used; only ears lobes are pierced with an ear piercing gun—sterile needles should be used for piercing other parts of the body.

Anyone who has received a tattoo or piercing at an unlicensed establishment, including a private home, is asked to contact the Health Department at 905-825-6000, or dial 311.
