The stars were out in Georgetown last December when the Georgetown Minor Hockey Association's annual Christmas tournament was officially renamed the Bob Goldham Memorial Tournament. Goldham, a Georgetown boy who graduated from Gordon Alcott's Little NHL in the 1930s, went on to win five Stanley Cups with the Toronto Maple Leafs and Detroit Red Wings.
