Live theatre. Is it dying?

At Globe Productions and other local theatre groups, there's no shortage of people who want to act, sing, dance, build sets, play instruments, etc. Globe has an excellent reputation and is an award-winning musical theatre group, successful even when competing with much larger Toronto area companies.

Today, the challenge is to get audiences to come out and support live theatre.
