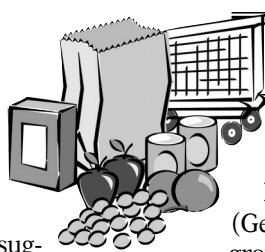


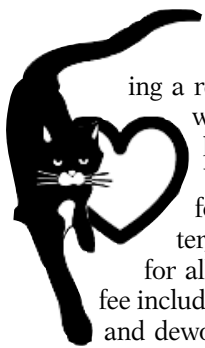
Buying groceries? The Bread Basket needs some items...
