Gellert site should be considered

It should be clarified that the arena task force was a GEORGETOWN Arena Task Force (GATF), a distinction that has been lost in parts of this discussion.

The GATF recommendation to twin Acton was largely based on receiving available stimulus government money due to the economic crisis at that time. Unfortunately, the Town was unsuccessful in that bid.

It is disappointing that members of council on the GATF did not lobby more diligently at council for the GATF recommendation to locate the Georgetown, 2.5 ice pad deficit with the recommended facility and preferred site,

The hospital addition should also take place but the Province should pay for the hospital addition through the Ministry of Health not by having the Town increase our local property taxes. Mayor Bonnette is going after the province now and I think because of our unique situation (having so many growing communities sitting on our borders) he has a pretty good case (in spite of a recent editorial suggesting he would fail). Remember, this is the mayor who fought so hard with the province to keep this hospital's (obstetrics ward) open in the first place.

With cost now the overriding issue, some hard questions need to be asked of council on their current recommendation.

The additional cost of, and availability of, parking, moving tennis/soccer/police facilities, adding additional youth and senior facilities, and the priority of facilities in Acton and Georgetown, to name a few.
